Forman A. Williams, director of Center for Energy and Combustion Research at the University of California, San Diego has been selected to receive the American Institute of Aeronautics Pendray Aerospace Literature Award for 1993.

The award--consisting of an engraved bronze medal, certificate of citation and a rosette pin--is presented each year for "an outstanding contribution or contributions to aeronautical and astronautical literature in the relatively recent past." Williams was presented the award during the 31st Aerospace Sciences Meeting & Exhibit, at the Reno Hilton Resort.

The citation for the award reads for "numerous, exceptionally clear, and vital contributions to the combustion science and technology literature that are recognized as advanced and fundamental expositions of a very side range of forefront technical issues."

Dr. G. Edward Pendray, for whom the award is named, was the founder and past president of the American Rocket Society.
