

LA artist Edward Ruscha and UCSD student artists open show

Concurrently running exhibitions by Los Angeles artist Edward Ruscha and University of California, San Diego student artists will open the Winter Quarter at UCSD.

Concerned with documenting life, Ruscha has composed books of photographs in which each subject is documented - from old girlfriends and scenes of the Sunset Strip to photographs of gas stations and a catalogue of stains on various materials. One such book, "Stains," is a hand-stained portfolio of some seventy different materials.

The exhibition includes copies of the documented books as well as a number of Ruscha's prints. It will be on display from January 9-26 in the UCSD Art Gallery located in Room 1260, Humanities-Library Bldg., Revelle College.

Adjacent to the UCSD Art Gallery is a new student gallery. Graduate and undergraduate visual arts majors will display their works with exhibitions rotating approximately every two weeks.

Hours for the UCSD Art Gallery and the new student gallery are from 12-5 p.m., daily, and from 8-10 p.m., Wednesdays.
