ANNUAL CHANCELLOR'S ASSOCIATES AND BOARD OF OVERSEERS DINNER HELD JUNE 25

The University of California, San Diego Chancellor's Associates and UCSD Board of Overseers held its 16th annual dinner dance in the Revelle College Dining Commons, Saturday, June 25.

Chancellor Richard C. Atkinson, and his wife Rita, hosted the event with Dean Dunphy, chairman of the Chancellor's Associates, and president of Dunphy Construction of San Diego, who served as master of ceremonies for a brief program during the dinner.

During the evening two members of the Associates--Jerome Katzin and Maxine White--were honored for their service to the campus. Each received a Chancellor's Associates Distinguished Service Medal. The award was created to recognize individuals who have made outstanding contributions of time, resources or creative effort to the campus.

Katzin is one of the driving forces behind the highly successful Judaic Studies Program and the 25th Anniversary Capital Campaign. He has also been chair of the UCSD Foundation's Investment and Audit committees.

"With his guidance and expertise the Foundation has developed a level of professional management commensurate with the financial assets the Foundation controls," said Atkinson.

White has been a longtime member and former president of Oceanids, a group of women supporters of UCSD.

"Maxine was both the fund-raising director for the Oceanids Pavilion at the International Center as well as a major donor to the building," Atkinson said.

She and her husband were major donors to the Cecil and Ida Green Faculty Club and she also organized the first in a series of UCSD support groups aimed at improving volunteer efforts on behalf of the campus.

White also oversaw the production of a book, "University in Motion," a history of UCSD. She has recently been instrumental in the purchase of a collection of historic photographs of the early days at UCSD.

Also honored were Dunphy and Dr. Mary Berglund, the outgoing chair of the Board of Overseers.

The Chancellor's Associates, which was started in 1966, is made up of friends of the university who contribute \$1,500 or more annually for the discretionary fund of the chancellor. There are currently some 336 members in the support group.

The Board of Overseers was established in 1973 as a community advisory board designed to assist the chancellor in the development and operation of the campus. It has continued to meet on a quarterly basis assisting in legislative, budgetary and community areas.

During the past year it sponsored an evening of campus arts events to introduce members of the San Diego community to the arts programs at UCSD.
