Dear Col. Fletcher:

In consideration of \$1 and other considerations, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, we give you or your assigns, an option for one year from date to purchase certain water rights as it affects the 153 acres, more orless, which we own in Sections 23, 35, and 26, Township 12 S, Range 1 West S.B.M. all as per legal description of agreement made with the City of San Diego for the purchase of same, the consideration to us to be \$15,000.00.

We agree as follows:

- 1. To transfer all riparian and all water rights not heretofore granted of record.
- 2. Give to you the right to divert the San Pasqual river water from the water shed by means of dams, pumping or otherwise.
- 3. An agreement to execute agreements or deeds of conveyance of some kind to the above containing words of conveyance approved by the City of San Diego. The final contract to be approved by the city attorney of the City of San Diego.
- 4. We reserve the right, when the water is available, to divert by gravity or pumping water for use upon the lands included in this option, not to exceed normal use for domestic and irrigation purposes.

We agree to put all papers in escrow when the money is placed in any bank in San Diego and will pay for the continuation of the certificate of title, which the City of San Diego now has in its possession, showing the property will be free and clear of encumbrance at the time the money is paid and the agreements go on record.

My dear Mr. Rockwood:

I am sorry to say that I did the best I could but got no favorable action from the City at yesterday's meeting. The matter has been postponed until Thursday.

I tried to get you by phone this morning and failed. Someone has tomake up \$7000 or \$8000 as I wrote you recently. It seems that those who are using the water are hard-headed and won't reduce their price, while all who are not using the gravity water and are not damaged should be more generous in lowering the price. I am trying to get all I can and thereby get more commission but I do not see any way out excepting the necessity of your reducing the price to \$3000. I have asked for a reduction of \$1000 from Mr. Boyle and the rest in proportion as best I can.

As the meeting will be held Thursday of this week, I ask that you please telephone me on receipt of this and also write me the best you will do so I may have it here for Thursday's meeting.
