Receipt of the above Fatrol Report is acknowledged with thanks.

Copies of my assessments are attached.

There is no reason why political education films could not be obtained for showing with the normal D.I.E.S. films (Refer Sitrep 2) in the village. It would seem to be a more palatable way of disseminating the political education message.

Please ensure that the Officer in Charge, Nuku, keeps a close watch on the Mission situation as reported in Sitrep No. 1. I would only suggest that you intervene if the situation worsens and then with the heads of the two Missions concerned.

For an annual Census/Area Study Patrol this Report is of a poor standard. My assessment is 'below average'.

Mr. Kitchens' comments in the latrol Report are too brief and cryptic to be of any real value. A lot more information under a variety of headings should have been provided, in order to give an overall assessment of the situation prevailing in the irea.

The Area Study smendments are, at times, difficult to understand and have not been detailed correctly. For example, under the heading Fossibilities of Expanding the Economy, I fail to understand the meaning of the statement "most villagers have now achieved a balance between cash crops and food gardens". Does this 'Balance' refer to the relative time spent on these two activities?

In his area study amendments Mr. Mitchens has not given a fully amended report under each heading. Each amended heading should be able to be substituted for what was previously written under that particular heading. For instance under Missions the overall picture with regard to the Missions in the area, should be presented. Instead of

this, remarks have been confined to the S.D.A. Mission only.

I do not understand why seports such as this, involving very little time on your part, cannot be submitted more promptly.

The Seventh Day Adventist church has set up a church under the direction of a New Ireland follower at AWES village.

They have been successful in atracting quite a following quickly. During the time of the patrol over two hundred people were baptised in the TIPPUMDA river

two hundred people were baptised in the TIPPUNDA river near AWES.
Villages attracted to the S.D.A mission are AWES HAMBASAMBA and SIBETELLA. AND USITAMO.

AWES village is adjacent to the Catholic churches mission at SEIM. Problems have arisen with the Catholic church. S.D.A followers are charged for treatment at the SEIM dispensary. Young members of the sewing circle and other mission activities have been told not to come any more. Whether this will have a backlash against the S.D.A mission or the C.M. is not apparent at this stage.

stage. The visiting european S.D.A advocates did not mention the tithe system which to the people of SEIM could be a determining factor.

J. COMMUNICATIONS.

(a) The YIPPUNDA (BONGOS) river is the border of NUKU area and SEIM census Division. \$7,500 has been allocated by the NUKU Council to have a causeway put across this river. \$5,000 has been transfered from DRELKIKIR Council for the section of read BONGOS r. - YAKRUMBOOK.

The provision of a reliable river crossing and the upgrading of the read on the BREIKIKIR stde will allow the read transport of cash crops and thus allow the introduction of a rice growers co-operative.

Cargo trucks have been able to deliver goods to the river this dry season. A causeway will mean read transport WEMAKANUKU. J . COMMUNICATIONS. 0

L. STAGE OF POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT.

The SEIM people while being the most economically advanced share the same level of political awareness. This is not great when considered by the criteria of conception of political institutions or familiarity with current politics.

Self Government and Independece Are words that are puzzling to the people as they are being increasingly used and still not understood.

Councillors of the Seim people play an active part in council meetings and command respect. They have been successfulin maintaining the best road in NUKU.

The patrol spent \$13215.00. This leaves \$2415.00 upgrading next dry season. It must be noted however that out of the \$2415.00 remaining only \$1010.00 is NUKU the reminder is DELIKIKE.



For an expenditure of \$13215.00 we have the following to show.

- 1/. 28 Miles of graded (formed only) Road.
- 2/. Causeway approaches constructed.
- 3/. 11 miles of gravelled, graded Road.
- 4/. 1 lile of feeder road to gravel source gravelled and formed.
- 5/. all mountains within 36 Miles of Road Bulldozed down.
- 6/. Bush cleared on both sides of Road for a distance of 150 feet each side for a total road length of 20 miles.
- 7/. Gement Culverts put in over 7 mile section.
- 8/. Side drains constructed five miles of road.
- 9/. Stockpile of Gravel for future use.

Therefore I feel we certainly got our money worth. We now have very nearly an all weather access from NUKU to the highway although more work will be needed next year.

The graded sections of road are 35 m.p.h. sections were and the gravelled 40 m.p.h. sections for the majority of the distance. No rolling was done at the time but next year road will be rolled during upgrading, I only hope tractors do not use it toomuch in the wet season without beeing rolled or such work will be wasted.

The Seim and Tagrumbok people worked exceptionally well and are a pleasure to work with, if only other Census Divisions followed Seim leadership the area could not fail to be progressive.

The only incident to "" the patrol was on accidental fire which destroyed an administrations tent fly.

Full co-operation was given the patrol by Missions, Admin. and P. D. Maprik. The loan of a PAT radio during the patrol was invaluable. Pedford Construction who supplied machinary were always most helpfull.

As can be seen by the diary we wonked 7 days per week, the marrenson for this was we were endevouring to beat the wet season.

Occasional visits to the stations for routinematter were attended to, but the use of the radio enabled the visits to be onlynecocry rarely, such as visitors to the stations etc.

No political situation arose t.e. Peli association during the course of the patrol although the area has many acceptable. A distant imprevation was gained that intrest is fading rapidly in the association and actual work themselves is the answer. Not cultism.

Court cases were attended to at the river after being sent from the Stations for hearing.

PATROL REPUT 1.

The road has accessablished a Bast Sepik Test Sepik linking, the only such link available opening up possibility of read cargo rather than expensive Admin. Charters of Armit. A trip from NUKU to MIMAK can now be achieved in about 6 hours in a Toyota. NUKU is no longer an isolated bush station, and development of the area should now be many times easier and faster. This road link is mx definately the most important thing towards NUKU'S development that has happend since its establishment.

Thank you for this report on which the following comments are made:-

- 1. Incidents such as occurred at wards 15 and 34 are not untoward nor are they to be unexpected in areas of low sophistication. Education and political education may improve the situation in course of time. Continuous, leieurely patrolling through a large portion of the Lumi Sub-District is important to ascertain such village level thoughts and to endeavour to clarify such thinking.
- 2. Although the patrolling officer may describe the incident at IFKUNDU as a monument to man's perversity it is more appropriately of the stresses and powers operating within the village to which he might beneficially have given more consideration.

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the patrol was the conduction of the Nuku Local Government Council General Elections. I myself conducted Team No. 1 covering the census divisions Makra-Kaiplei and Seim. Within these census divisions there are thirteen Wards. Both census divisions lie to the South and Southeast of Nuku Patrol Poot. The Wards being numbers 11, 22, 33, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 34. The total population within the area is 7,621. Of the thirteen Wards seven elections were held. In the remaining six Wards candidates were elected unopposed. In the Wards that elections were being and ward No. 19 which went to the second count and Ward No. 19 which went to the second count and Ward No. 11 which went to the fourth count. Of a total of 1,422 votes taken, no informal votes were recorded. Two Of a total of 1,422 votes taken, no informal votes were recorded. TYPE AND DURATION OF PRE-ELECTION CAMPAIGN

Oiscussions on the general elections for the Nuku Local Government Council were held by the Council at their last meeting held prior to the elections. The local populace was given sufficient notice of the forth council election. Copies of the relling schedule were distributed to all Councillors in each Ward. These were also distributed amongst Mission and Administration personnel. Prior to the polling team's arrival at pelling places notification was given at least one day in advance. On arrival at polling places a short introductory talk was given to the villagers. It is considered that the villagers were relatively in the know about the elections.

MANNER OF ELECTION

The elections were conducted in the manner as set down under "Local Government (Electoral Provision) Regulations 1970 as amended to data". Rominations were taken from prespective candidates one hour prior to the commencement of polling. The candidates names were then written on a piece of paper and deposited in the Ballot box. The names were then written on no at a time by an independent person to select order of candidates on the ballot papers. Ballot papers were then written up. Voters names were then called out of the roll of electors and their respective votes taken. After the completion of polling and all electors present having cast their vote the count was commenced and the successful candidate advised.

CENTRAL INTEREST IN ELECTIONS

Position interest in the elections at places where polling was held were caraltered and make. The percentage of Female participation in the alretions where polling was held was 05.5%. The greatest interest by Females was at Hambergri Village in Need Be. 20 where approximately 90% of Females wated, No Females stood as candidates.

ISCIPCUTS

The first incident occurred at Ward No. 34. The petrol errived at Amaesi Village which was the designated politing piece for that Ward, Word was sent out to the villagore of Akasamoi Nos. 1 and 2 that nominetions for candidates sould place at 3:00 a.m. the following merring. That night one momentation was taken from Armed Willers by 8:00 A.m. no Further neminations had been taken, and as two Councillers had to be alected an orthogen of time use given until 10:00 A.M. Passages were sent three times by native druss to the two Akasami Villages for them to attend the politing and put forward any further nominations. The willages refused to see due to the fact that Amesei was designated politing place for the Ward instead of the usual place for holding such gatherings which is at the "House Kiep" at Akasum No. 1 Villege. I then possonally walked appose to those villeges and discussed the methor informing the people that if they wished to nominate a condidate they would have to procent the solver at the solving place at harmed prior to 10:00 A.M. I then retraned to Anasol. On orrival it was discovered that one further person had meminated from Amasei Village. Hithin minutes the provious Coumpiller room (kasemal No. 1 also was nominated. At approximately 918E A.M. the profices councillor from Atomeso No. 2 Villege with followers errived, I inquir or as to whother he would wish to re-moninote and he replied in the negotive. At 19:00 A.M. no further nominations had been received and therefore tipe clouds After the commonment of polling a further group of uilleges from Akamani No. 2 presented thouselves and wished to nominate another candidate. They uses informed that I had given them sufficient time and notification and that as polling had occasioned I sould not essent their nomination. Both skamesod the 1 and 2 willages are only a helf hour's walk away from the polling ploca. The willagers became rather inste, but I kept to by decision. Politing then continued until 42 completion, a condicate from Assest and Skowsmal Bo. 1 willogs were lected. The matrol then experon to Yiriwandi Villago to conduct a further election. The following sorn ag a group of villagers from Heatman No. 2 Village accompanied by the proving Councillor from that village approached me with a complaint. I further relterated by provious decision and let metters lie at that. The will goes then deported.

The second incident occurred at Ifkinds Village An Ward No. 15. When reminstance were called the people porceeded we and veload their opinion that they wished the provices Councillar Tensesche Relagii to be elected uneproceed. I then asked Tomascabe Ralagii if he wished to stand and he replied no, not unless the villagers elected another semilidate to sun against him. The villagers discussed the matter for Iffican anductes and put forward enother condidate mased Kanasso Vole, a young man of little impostance in the village. The politing them occamended and Kanasso Vole and stated a Ranasso then establish and would provide years. This whole incident at Ifkinds is a manuscrit to works porversity.

ASSENTGELON

During the elections the $m_{\rm e}$ jority of the electrons were make. Of a total of 2,205 slegible unders 4,422 word making a percentage of 64.5. Those obsent were mostly working on plantations outside of the district, and approximately 16 were electron people and those fore unable to attend the electrons.

STATISTICS

Statistics form 10 is attached. Of the total of 13 Words seven were contacted, At the remaining six conditation got in unopposed. Wards Nees 11, 14, 10, 21 and 34 each have two Councillars, the remaining wards Nee 12, 13, 15, 16, 16, 17, 19, 20 and 22 each have one Councillor. Where polling was held preferences were not required except for Mark Ne. 19 where a second count was taken and Ward Nee. 11 where a fourth count was baken, No. informal vater were recorded.

YEARTHE

Apart from the two incidents already reported upon the elections proceeded quite according. The sajesty of the people were quite heavy with the results and it is considered that the sajesty of the elected Gruncillars will be comparent during their term of office.

Fragmontation has occurred on internal matters, but I to not think this is serious. On matters of real importance, the area rumains wellk united.

Comprehension of Covernment machinery is extremely poor for an area of such prolonged Administration contact. The basic concepts of Local Government are well comprehended, but overnment proceedures on a national level are poorly understood.

Co-Operative conferences have been held in Buku and the est Palei. Membership of the newly formed Co-Operative would not benefit the Society or the people from the West Palei. I am sure most people regard the Co-perative Cociety as a new form

However this school as yet not been registered but it will be some times this year. The three teachers at that school have been provided, by the Catholic Mission, bisides that there is no support from outside.

L. THE STAGE OF POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT.

- 1. Politically the area suveyed is underdeveloped. The main ties bieng blood relationship, where cohesion exists.
- 2. Political Education is the key to the misunderstanding people of the MaiMai/Mamble Commus Division, because at present the people have very little knowledge of the Central Severament and are very much opposed to the early timining of Self Cov't.
- 3. There was no Cargo Cult evident in the area. However the 1972 cult has reached its climate. The people only did sent observers to the Mt. TURU, there was also no evident of contribuctions to the Falei Association as far as the patrol was concerned.
- 4. There was no one from the Area been to any conference outside of Nuku/Lumi area.

M. MIONOMIC OF THE AREA.

In the whole of the Census Division there are 4,142 mature coffee trees and 2,357 immature. The total production for 1972/73 was coffee 7,960 lbs and approximately 56 coffee growers. For Paddy rice the total production for 1972/73 was 90,798 lbs. All these figures were relised by 1.4.5.7. Nuku up to date statistics for 1971/72 and 1972/73, Mowever most of the rice preduced in the whole Census Division was from the Mamble group of villages and only little bit free around Mukili area. The figures relised by the P.A.S.F. was on the 16th June, 1975.
