UCSD ANNOUNCES 1992 COMMENCEMENT AWARDS TO OUTSTANDING GRADS

Graduation ceremonies for five colleges at the University of California, San Diego were highlighted with the conferring of special awards and honors in addition to the more than 2,300 undergraduate degrees handed out Saturday, June 13 and Sunday, June 14.

The UCSD colleges conferring undergraduate degrees were Revelle, Muir, Third, Warren and Fifth. Fifth College, which enrolled its first undergraduate class in 1988, graduated its first senior class on June 13.

The Revelle College academic award winners are: Theresa Lynn Bradley, English and American Literature; Oliver Wynn Herndon, Biochemistry and Cell Biology; Renee Lynn Herstoff, Psychology; Laura Cochran Hoover, Russian and Soviet Studies and Delphine Juihoa Lee, Biochemistry and Cell Biology.

Revelle College seniors who won campuswide academic awards are: Jeffrey Rene Ostrick, the Shang-Keng Ma Award in Physics and Marcey Lynn Waters, the Harold C. Urey Award in Chemistry.

The UCSD Oceanids Award for Outstanding Service to the UCSD Community was given to Allison May Chung. The Revelle College Academic and Leadership Award was given to David Herbert Donovan. The UCSD Alumni Association Service Award was presented to Holly Anne Foust.

The Muir College academic award winners are: Timothy Charles Haeg, Philosophy; David Carl Heikkila, Theatre; Erik Odin Ulman, English/American Literature and Music, and Laura Franey, English/American Literature and History. Franey is the co-recipient of the UCSD Department of Literature Sigurd Burckhardt Prize. She also is the winner of a Mellon Fellowship.

Muir College seniors who won campuswide academic awards are: Evan Theodore Saulino, Chemistry and Biochemistry, the Joseph E. Mayer Award in Chemistry and Timothy Charles Haeg, the Eric Paul Allison Memorial Award in Philosophy. David Heikkila won the Jacob Bronowski Prize for Outstanding Senior in the Department of Theatre.
