As I am going to leave this place for a few months and having business that requires to be settled before my return I wish to employ you to do the the same, and what ever is right I am willing to pay you for doing the same

I have sent to San Francisco to Sheet & Write about forty barrals of Oil the returns of which will be sent here to me, the amount of which will be sufficient to pay all my liabilities here, I wish you to settle with Mr Donahue and pay what small orders that may be presented

~~I also wish you to settle with Mr Brown my arrangement with him is thus in the first place the vessell draws one share or one fourth the remaining three fourths are to be divided between three of us each paying an equal share of for the provisions, he will have the bills so that it is easily settled the amount that is owing to you on my account you will also settle, and should there be any thing left keep it untill my return~~

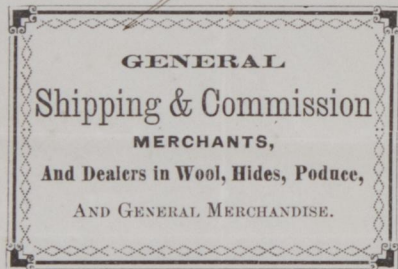
