

## Bishop Tutu to speak at UCSD

## January 15, 1986

South African Anglican Bishop Desmond Tutu, winner of the 1984 Nobel Peace Prize for his anti-apartheid activities, will speak at the University of California, San Diego Thursday, January 23.

Tutu is scheduled to deliver his talk in the Main Gym at 3 p.m.

A few hundred unreserved tickets at \$3 each have been set aside for the general public and will go on sale at the UCSD Box Office, located in the Student Center, beginning Thursday, January 16.

Tickets are limited to two per person and must be purchased in person at the box office. No telephone reservations will be accepted. The box office is open from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Because Bishop Tutu's appearance comes during the normal school day, parking on campus can be quite difficult and is allowed by permit only.

Special parking for the event, at a cost of \$1, will be available at the Gliderport adjacent to the Salk Institute on North Torrey Pines Road. Allow for a walk of about 20 minutes to the Gym. Free shuttle bus service to the Gym will be available starting at 2 p.m. To reach the Gliderport, take the Genesee Avenue offramp from Interstate 5, west to North Torrey Pines Road, then south to the Gliderport entrance.

The public is advised to arrive early since there will be no admittance to the Gym once the Bishop has begun his talk.

Tutu's appearance is part of an 18-day fund-raising tour of the United States which began January 8 in Washington, D.C.

His UCSD appearance is being coordinated by history professor Edward Reynolds and is sponsored by numerous campus and community groups.
