

Paul Knopf named head of UCSD Campus and Community Planning Office

Paul H. Knopf, Assistant Campus and Community Planner at the University of California, San Diego for the past six months, has been named head of that office on the San Diego campus.

Knopf, a veteran of over 20 years in the planning field, will replace John S. Rule who is moving to the Office of the President in Berkeley as Coordinator - Physical Planning. Rule will work in the areas of planning and budgeting for physical facilities.

Knopf transferred to the San Diego campus in August, 1972, from the UC Riverside campus where he was the Campus and Community Planner for five years. Prior to that he was an Associate Planner at the UCLA campus for five years and Campus Planner at the University of Hawaii for three years.

Knopf has a bachelor's degree in landscape architecture and a master's degree in planning from the University of Michigan.
