UCSD'S ASSOCIATE VICE CHANCELLOR FOR ACADEMIC PLANNING IS NOMINATED UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA PROVOST

Stanley A. Chodorow, associate vice chancellor for academic planning and dean of arts and humanities at the University of California, San Diego, has been nominated for the position of provost at the University of Pennsylvania, it was announced today by University of Pennsylvania President-elect Judith Rodin.

The University of Pennsylvania board of trustees will vote on Chodorow's nomination on April 22. Chodorow will succeed Interim Provost Marvin Lazerson, who will return to teaching.

As provost, Chodorow will be chief academic officer next to Penn's president, and will be responsible for coordinating and overseeing the educational policies of all sectors of the institution, including undergraduate and graduate education, Penn's 12 professional schools, and the various centers for research and scholarship.

Chodorow's duties at UCSD include responsibility for academic planning and accreditation. He has planning authority over UCSD's arts and sciences. Additionally, he chairs the enrollment projection committee and works with faculty committees that deal with the planning and review of academic programs.

Chodorow continues to teach and engage in research. In the 1992-93 academic year he taught an undergraduate seminar in medieval literature and culture and an interdisciplinary lecture course for freshman. In 1992, he completed the acclaimed "Proceedings of the Eighth International Congress of Medieval Canon Law," published by the Bibliotheca Apostolica Vaticana, and he recently completed the sixth edition of "The Mainstream of Civilization," a textbook for undergraduates.

Chodorow received his Ph.D. in medieval history from Cornell University in 1968, and joined the UCSD faculty as assistant professor that same year. In 1978, he was promoted to full professor. He chaired the UCSD Academic Senate from 1982-83, and joined the UCSD administration in 1983.

A resident of La Jolla, Chodorow is married to Peggy Chodorow, also a graduate of Cornell University, and a successful real estate broker at Coldwell Banker in La Jolla. Mrs. Chodorow will join her husband in Philadelphia in 1995. They have two sons.
