

June Tapp to participate in first national forum of the American Council on Education

Dr. June L. Tapp, provost of Revelle College at the University of California, San Diego, was one of 20 women educational administrators chosen to participate in the first National Forum of the American Council on Education to be held in Racine, Wisconsin, Sept. 29-30.

The forum is being held as part of an effort by the Office of Women in Higher Education to begin a national identification program with the primary goal of advancing women who have shown promise for major positions in academic administration.

According to the Office, the National Identification program is "intended to result in the establishment of a personalized system of identification, recommendation, and advancement of women administrators, and, therefore, in an increased number of women prominent in higher education.

"The program involves a carefully constructed state or regionally based system for providing a national network of women and men interested in developing a firm system of equality of opportunity."

Dr. Tapp, a nationally-known professor of child psychology, came to UC San Diego in 1976 from the University of Minnesota, to become the first woman provost in the school's history.
