

Dr. John J. Holland awarded postdoctoral fellowship

Dr. John J. Holland, professor of biology at the University of California, San Diego has been awarded a postdoctoral fellowship for research at the Institute of Molecular Biology of the University of Geneva, Switzerland.

Holland was one of 58 United States scientists selected for the awards by the National Science Foundation. The winners were chosen from a field of 338 applicants by panels of outstanding scientists appointed by the National Research Council.

The fellowship becomes effective July 1, 1970, and covers a year of study and research at the Swiss university.

Holland also has been appointed to the editorial advisory board of Biochemistry, a publication of the American Chemical Society. He was one of 11 United States biochemists whose appointments to the 32-man board were announced yesterday by the Society.

Holland resides at 14202 Pinewood in Del Mar, with his wife, Dottie, and two children, Mark and Lynn. His family will accompany him to Geneva for the year of study.
