

## Program of Music for Advent and Christmas to be performed by the Early Music Quartet

## **December 8, 1975**

A program of Music for Advent and Christmas will be presented by the Early Music Quartet San Diego Friday at 8 p.m. in the Main Lobby of the Central University Library at the University of California, San Diego.

The Early Music Quartet, making its third appearance at UC San Diego, was formed in 1970 and has made several tours of California and Switzerland, although it has concentrated its performances in the San Diego area, primarily at colleges and universities.

The Friday concert includes "mass movements, canticles, motets, and Responsoria," among them "Pieces en Concert" by Francois Couperin, "Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring" by Johann Sebastian Bach, and "Agnus DO," a Barcelona mass from fourteenth century Spain.

Members of the ensemble are: Elisabeth Marti, Del Mar, soprano and bells; Kathryn Christensen, soprano, bells and harpsichord; John Peeling, tenor, counter-tenor and bells; James Paul, of Del Mar, tenor, counter-tenor, and director of the group; John Youmans, Riverside, bass and bells; John Haak, San Diego, cello; Fred Benedetti, guitar and bells; and Philip Lawson, guitar.

The free concert is one of the special events in a series sponsored by the Friends of the UCSD Library. The Friends is an educational organization which brings together San Diego area residents with a common interest in books, libraries and promoting the development of the UCSD libraries.

The series of lectures and music has been planned to encourage greater contact with the university for members of the Friends and the general public.

Following the one-and-a-half-hour concert Friday, refreshments will be served.
