Denice Denton, Chancellor, UC Santa Cruz

On June 24, 2007—the one-year anniversary of her passing—we remember, celebrate, and pay tribute to Denice Denton, UC Santa Cruz's ninth chancellor. Chancellor Denton was an out member of our community, and the highest-ranking LGBT person at the University of California. Her loss was, and still is, particularly palpable to us, the members of her LGBT community. A trailblazing engineer who broke through numerous barriers in her academic career, Denice took the helm at UC Santa Cruz in February 2005 after



serving nine years as the dean of the College of Engineering at the University of Washington in Seattle. Her life was filled with many "firsts," and she became a powerful role model and mentor for women and minorities in science and higher education.

Reinaldo Arenas (July 16, 1943 December 7, 1990) was a Cuban poet, novelist. and

playwright who despite his

early sympathy for the 1959 revolution, grew critical of and then rebelled against the Cuban government.

Old Rosa is composed of two stories that converge on a single charged point in the lives of a Cuban mother and son. We meet Rosa as a young woman, tall, proud, shrewd, always in control. But her world beguins to crumble when her oldest son runs off to join Castro's rebels and she finds her youngest son, her "brightest star," in bed with another boy.

The second story finds this youngest son in one of Castros camps for homosexuals. subjected to mind-numbing labor and unrelieved brutality. To sruvive, he writes - on paper bags and torn-off scraps of political posters, and in the margins of stolen official documents.



Common sense has dictated that there are two genders--female and male. But this perspective is becoming less accepted and making less sense for many people.

Pat Califia's Sex Changes is a frank, forthright, and sometimes funny challenge to the traditional ideas about gender and sexuality. Transgenderism is the term used to describe people who feel they belong to both, or neither, traditional genders. Califia -- a vocal sex radical as well as a therapist--explores the worlds of biology, sociology, psychology, and politics and comes to the conclusion that life and personal is far more experience complicated than most people believe and that the simple twogender system most people accept is more harmful that helpful.

Clear-headed writing and enormous empathy for everyone who exists outside of "the norm" make Sex Changes challenging and vital reading. (from Amazon.com editorial review)


We need YOU to help with Pride!

Presidential Candidates In First Ever Gay Debate

For the first time the leading candidates for the presidency will hold a televised debate devoted solely to LGBT issues.

The one-hour event will be held on August 9 and broadcast on gay network LOGO at 9:00 pm ET (6:00 pm ET) and through live streaming video at LOGOonline.com. Hillary Clinton, Barack Obama and John Edwards have confirmed they will participate. Several other Democratic candidates also may join the debate. The debate will be conducted with a live audience in Los Angeles. On the panel questioning the two Democrats will be Human Rights Campaign president Joe Solmonese and singer Melissa Etheridge. The debate was put together by LOGO and HRC.

"In the 2008 presidential election, issues of concern to the LGBT community have already been at the forefront of the national conversation," said Solmonese. "From the repeal of "Don't ask, Don't Tell" to the recent signing of a civil unions bill in New Hampshire, there is no doubt that voters will demand answers to important questions affecting our community."

The panelists in a statement said they plan to cover a range of issues including relationship recognition, marriage equality, workplace fairness, the military, hate crimes, HIV/AIDS and other important issues. The LGBT vote is considered a decisive electoral force and according to exit poll data make up approximately 4 percent of the voting population. Los Angeles was chosen as the site for the event because of the state's early primary election, on February 5th, 2008.

Love Makes a Family: Portraits of Lesbian, Gay, **Bisexual, and Transgender Parents and Their Families**

This collection of informal family portraits and interviews with lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) parents and their children grew out of a photo exhibit created by photographer Myriad Kaeser. family configurations



are presented: gay and lesbian couples,

divorced

lesbians coparenting, single parents, transgendered parents, and stepparents and their children. From text accompanying the photographs, we learn who these people consider family and why as they speak about their feelings and experiences as part of an LGBT family. The interviews reveal many of the same joys and struggles as found in other families in addition to the challenges of being an LGBT family in a predominantly heterosexual world. Most enlightening are the children's words; some tell of teasing and hostility directed toward them because of their family, while others simply state that they have two moms or two dads and a family is the people who love you.

"We're honored to give the presidential candidates an historic opportunity to share their views directly with the LGBT audience," Brian Graden, President, Entertainment, MTV Networks Music Group, and President, LOGO said in a statement. "This forum continues MTV Networks' tradition of engaging vital niche audiences with voting and the electoral process." In addition to questioning by Solmonese and Etheridge people will be able to pose their own questions through LOGOonline.com and HRC.org.




This year we are #13 in the parade line up! That is amazing, and it means we will step off right around 11am, and should be finished around 12 noon.
