

The History of Q Camp

Q Camp began in the fall of 2002 withonly 13 registrants. Proclaimed as a huge success by those attending, the event grew primarily by word of mouth in its second year.

With the addition of counselors from the UCSD LGBT community who led discussions, the numbers of registrants more than doubled, with 30 participants. In 2004, the campus was canvassed by a core of counselors and volunteers, 46 people registered, and even more attended the event.

For the 2005 edition of Q Camp, counselors went through extensive co-training with UCSD's Queer Peer Support Program, and Q Fair was added as an opportunity for our entire community to connect with Q Campers during an informal resource fair.

Q Camp continues to grow, and has evolved into the quickest and easiest ways for incoming students to connect to the LGBT community.

How to create an LGBT Group or Organization

The first step in creating an organization is to find some likeminded folks that want to organize with you. This can be done through flyers, e-mail postings, articles in the Rainbow Newsletter, through word-of-mouth, and any other means you can think of!

Once you have a core group, there are many levels of organizing. Some groups simply choose a time, date and place to meet, advertise the group, and there is nothing more formal in place. Fluid Sexuality and Queering Gender are examples of this kind or organization.

Other groups are part of broader organizations and coalitions. For example, the Alliance is a part of the Associated Students. The Umbrella Group is member organization of the larger Staff Associations. QPOC is a member organization of the Student Affirmative Action Committee (SAAC).

Some groups go through extensive training of the leadership in order to serve their membership. Women's Group, Men's group and QPSP are examples of this kind of organization.

determining that something good can be constructed in the midst of great evil, and it can only be personal. With an eclectic mix of memoir, social history, diatribe, journalism and cultural criticism, he defends and celebrates the sex-positive ways gay men have continued to connect in the face of an ongoing catastrophe.

died Hardy, who in mountaineering accident before AIDS could kill him, believed HIV is not the enemy of sex; its the antagonist of love, and that even against death, revolution can be joyful. At its most incisive, the book documents AIDSs great governmental institutional inaction and the loss of most of a generation of gay men... who would have told the rest of us how to grow old, how to be adult. Hardy was a first-rate journalist whose honesty and intelligence are most evident in his personal history, particularly his account of a Dutch lovers state-sanctioned euthanasia. The greatest strength of the book is in its portraiture and reminiscences.
