SUBJECT: Dedication ceremony for "Mandeville Electron Microscope"

WHEN: 10 a.m., Wednesday, August 12

WHERE: Room 3065, Basic Science Building, UCSD School of Medicine

ATTENDING: Among those on hand will be Ernest J. Mandeville, San Diego philanthropist who donated the instrument, and Dr. Robert Livingston, retiring chairman of the Department of Neurosciences, who will leave immediately after the ceremony on a month's stay in Russia.

WHAT: Plaque will be placed on the huge electron microscope in honor of the donor. The \$25,000 instrument, used in the study of the nervous system, is one of three given to UCSD by Mandeville. The other two will be presented at later time. The mammoth microscope magnifies tissue cells some 18,000 times.
