

## **UCSD Alumni Association awards banquet**

## June 13, 1985

The University of California, San Diego Alumni Association will present its Outstanding Faculty Member award to UCSD sociologist and author Kristin Luker during the association's annual banquet on June 15. The association will also honor UCSD's five outstanding seniors and architect Joseph P. Martinez, alumnus of the year.

The event will be held at 8 p.m. at the Westgate Hotel, in downtown San Diego.

John Cambon, president of the UCSD Alumni Association Board of Directors, will be the master of ceremonies. Also present will be members of the board of directors of the alumni association and its executive director Dan Rodriguez.

Luker, an associate professor of sociology, is the author of the recently published book, "Abortion and the Politics of Motherhood." In April she received a Guggenheim fellowship for a new project on the history of the sex education movement in America, from 1880 to 1980.

Martinez is president of the architectural firm of Martinez/Wong & Associates of San Diego, a practicing architect who received his master of arts in architecture degree from Harvard University in 1975, where he was awarded a National American Institute of Architects Fellowship and the Alcoa Aluminum Scholarship for academic excellence. He graduated from UCSD in 1971.

To date, the firm of Martinez/Wong has designed more than 220 projects in the Southwest, with a construction value in excess of \$450 million. He is the recipient of two citation awards from the American Institute of Architects for design excellence and a merit award from the American Planning Association.

Martinez has also won six first place awards in regional or national design competitions, and the firm was awarded second place out of 67 competing firms for its design for the \$100 million San Diego Convention Center. He is married to Estala Salazar, a 1979 graduate of Muir College, and has two sons.

Lucy Killea, Assemblywoman for the 78th Assembly District, will present awards to four outstanding graduating seniors, one from each of UCSD's colleges, and to an outstanding senior athlete. Student awards are given for a combination of academic excellence and a high voluntary involvement in community, cultural or political affairs.

The outstanding senior awards will be awarded to: Jamie Baudizzon, Revelle College, from Weaverville, California; Harriet Happel, Third College, from Oceanside; Jon Irwin, outstanding athlete, from San Diego; Lani Kain, Warren College, from San Diego; and Steve Krems, Muir College, from Beverly Hills.
