Subject: Water Usage - San Pasqual Valley.

At your request I have reviewed the Court proceedings in the matter of the Water Adjudication for the San Pasqual Valley ditches, and find, with the exception of the Henry Johnson property, no record of individual water apportionment, and find no filed record of the lands upon which this water was to be used. On the contrary, a lack of filed information, devastated ditches due to the 1916 flood, the change of ownership and both legal and personal disputes leave any of the deductions which follow open to question as to their validity.

HISTORY OF WATER RIGHTS

West San Pasqual Ditch

In 1853 the West San Pasqual Ditch was built with capacity of 1200 M.I. and diverted water at the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 35, Township 12 South, Range 1 West, S.B.M. carrying it down the north side of San Pasqual Valley. The ditch decreased in carrying capacity until the flood of 1916 at which time the average draft for the five preceding years was about 400 Miner's Inches. No draft records have been made since 1916. At that time the head end of the ditch was washed out and has recently been rebuilt.

East San Pasqual Ditch

On December 25, 1876 W. R. Stewart, A. F. Brown, John Judson, Archibald Clevenger, John Clevenger and Robert French approximated 1440 Miner's Inches of water to be diverted in Section 36, T. 12 S., R. 1 W., S.B.M. for use along the south side of the Valley. (See

Misc. Records, Book 4, page 276) In 1877 this ditch was built with a capacity of 700 M.I. to utilize the surplus waters not needed for the West San Pasqual Ditch. For the last five years the average diversion has been about 400 M.I.

On September 18, 1882 John B. Judson, Henry Johnson, Jens Olson, A. H. Striplin and A. D. Trussell to whom these rights had been transferred, granted same to the Pamo Water Company; also a strip of land 50 feet wide for conduit right of way. This grant applied to lands in Sections 35 and 36, T. 12 S., R. 1 W., S.B.M., and carried all riparian rights and rights to impound and divert waters with it. In return a 10 Miner's Inch steady flow was to be allowed from the Company's conduit in quantities ranging from one to 200 M.I. All contingent upon ability to begin construction work within 90 days from September 18, 1882 (Deeds Book 155, page 106).

On or about September 22, 1896 the East San Pasqual people formed themselves (L. O. Johnson excepted) into the East San Pasqual Water and Improvement Company (Inc.) wherein they deeded all their right in and to said water of said San Pasqual River as diverted in and through the East San Pasqual Ditches subject to a Pamo Water Co. contract above mentioned.

Adjudication of Ditch Rights

Before and since April 15th, 1898 there has been several law suits between the West San Pasqual and the East San Pasqual water users and other parties; the most important one entitled Gaspar Huffner et al vs John B. Judson et al. The plaintiff (Huffner et al) representing the West San Pasqual people and the defendant, those living in

East San Pasqual. The decision adjudged and decreed on above date

(Case No. 10007 Superior Court of San Diego County by Judge E. S. Torrance
that the waters of the San Pasqual River should be divided and partitioned
as follows:

(a) The East San Pasqual Ditch to receive full flow of Santa
Isabel River August 15th to January 15th of each year.

(b) The East and West Ditches are to alternate in the use of
water from January 15th to August 15th of each year.

(c) West San Pasqual Ditch to divert the full flow of the
River for 20 days starting with the 15th of each month and finishing
on the 5th day of the month ensuing.

(d) East San Pasqual ditch to divert the full flow of the
River for 10 days commencing on the 5th day and ending the 15th day of
each month.

(e) From the East San Pasqual Ditch Henry Johnson shall
divert for his own use the full flow of the river one day each 30 days
from August 15th to January 15th of the next ensuing year and one day
each 10 days between January 15th and August 15th of each year.

When there is plenty of water for both ditches both use.

With a ditch capacity of 400 M.I. and 140 days run of water, the 451 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land would receive in that time the following amount of water:

1 Miner's Inches for one day -----	1,728 cu. ft.
1 " " " 140 days -----	241,920 "

451 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres = 19,667,340 sq. ft.	

The 96,768,000 + 19,667,340 = 4.92 ft. in depth that the water would cover the land during the period from January 15th to August 15th of each year. There is of course a material loss by seepage from the earth ditches. This may amount to one-half of this amount and still there would be an ample supply for intense cultivation.

These figures, together with the uncertainty of the individuals right to use water as mentioned in the first paragraph of this letter, will tend to show that a correct and definite usage is not now established on the West San Pasqual Ditch and that this applies to some extent anywhere in the Valley.

Actual Amount Diverted

Attached is an estimate of the amount of water diverted by each ditch during the years 1912 to 1915 inclusive. It must not be presumed that the 400 M.I. ditch capacity represented herewith implies that a constant flow of this character is available from Jan. 15th to Aug. 15th of each year. This period is set forth in the adjudication but by consulting the records of diversion attached, no such continuous use has ordinarily been possible. The stream usually is capable of delivering this amount between March and June.

During the period between January 15th and August 15th the above are entitled to 10 days diversion each month or 70 days. With a ditch capacity of 400 M.I. and 70 days run of water the 250 acres of land would receive in that time (in addition to the full flow of the River from Aug. 15th to January 15th) the following amount of water:

1 Miner's Inches for one day ----- 1,728 cu. ft.

400 " " " 70 days ----- 48,384,000 "

250 acres = 10,018,800 sq. ft.

The 48,384,000 + 10,018,800 = 4.83 ft. in depth that the water would cover the land during period stated above. This includes losses by seepage, etc.

From the nature of the foregoing information, together with that embodied in letter to Col. Fletcher dated December 11, 1917, and the uncertainty that exists because of the indefinite nature of the 1898 ditch water adjudication, the correct thing to do is to take immediate steps to protect the Company's water rights throughout the entire San Pasqual Valley. At this time it can be shown by testimony what the minimum established use has been over a period of low years. Later on new diversions will be established and a greater demand for water created. Much uncertainty exists as to the effect of various transfers upon the riparian status of certain land. This matter will take a careful examination to find what actual rights now exist.

Herewith are included copies of various notices of appropriation; also estimates of flow of water through the East and West San Pasqual Ditches, 1912 to 1915 inclusive, and other data; all of which have bearing on the subject.

The following water appropriation made by H. Taylor at Carroll Damsite was filed in the Recorder's Office of San Diego County at the request of Ed Fletcher Co. (Makin) February 24, 1914, at 25 minutes past 10 o'clock A. M. and is recorded in Water Claims Book 4, page 203, a copy of which is given herewith.

Mr. Taylor assigned this appropriation to Ed Fletcher, same being filed October 22, 1914 at 5 minutes past 9 o'clock A.M. and recorded in Water Claims Book 4, page 248.

Mr. Fletcher has not to this date transferred these rights.

NOTICE OF APPROPRIATION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the undersigned H. Taylor, claims and appropriates all the water flowing or hereafter to flow in the channel of the Bernardo River, otherwise known as the San Dieguito River or Santa Isabel River in the County of San Diego, State of California, at the point where this notice is posted, being in the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 18, Township 13 South, Range 2 West, San Bernardino Meridian, together with the water from all creeks or affluents of said river, to the extent of Ten Thousand Inches measured under a four inch pressure of the continuous flow of said stream.

The purposes for which said H. Taylor appropriates and claims said water are for the irrigation of land in the said County of San Diego, State of California, and for horticultural and agricultural purposes and said lands and for domestic purposes.

The places of intended use of said water are on the following described lands situated in the County of San Diego, State of California, to-wit:

On the Bernardo Rancho, San Dieguito Rancho, Agua Hedionda Rancho and Los Penasquitos Rancho, on lands included in the Linda Vista Irrigation District; on lands in the City of San Diego, California, and on lands in fractional townships as follows:

Township 13 South, Range 4 West; Township 13 South, Range 4 West; Township 14 South, Range 4 West; Township 14 South, Range 3 West; and Township 14 South, Range 2 West, San Bernardino Meridian.

The means by which said H. Taylor intends to divert the said water is by the construction of a solid dam across the channel of said river at the point where this notice is posted as aforesaid, 150 feet in height more or less, in order to divert sufficient waters of said stream to make up with the flow of said stream the said continuous flow of Ten Thousand Inches of water so measured as aforesaid, also by means of a flume, ditch, cement aqueduct, tunnels and pipes leading from said dam, the same to be 10 feet in width and 4 feet in height on a grade of 5 feet per mile, or in the case of a circular conduit the same to be 5 feet in diameter on a grade of 25 feet per mile, the same to be sufficient size to carry the requisite amount of water at each respective point and diminishing as the supply is utilized along the line of said conduit.

The place of intended diversion of said water is the place where said dam is to be constructed and where this notice is posted as heretofore stated, and also at points along the margin of the Reservoir, created by said dam where water will be diverted by pumps.
