

Education is the due development of all the primitive powers & susceptibilities of our nature.

Particular laws:- We require active exercise, for 2 or more hours each day, in the open air by the sun's light,

The room occupied by children should be at all times supplied with fresh air, in abundance,

The body of a child should not be kept too long in one unvaried position - should not be allowed to sit still more than 15 minutes, if under 4 & 30 if under 12 or 1 hour ~~at~~ any age.

That the skin should be kept constantly clean,

Every child requires 7, 8, or 9 hours of undisturbed sleep in the early part of the night, in a well ventilated chamber,

No unnecessary exertion of mind or body should be used immediately after a meal, not even a hurried walk.

The fruit proverb. It is gold in the morning, silver at noon, & lead at night. it should be a substitute for food not an addition, bad practice to eat in the evening especially the indigestible dried fruits & nuts,

None but a person who uses a great deal of active exercise can use fat with impunity

Keep the head cool, the feet warm & the body free.

Those who pass from an active to a sedentary life, should restrict themselves to $\frac{1}{2}$ their usual quantity of food at intervals of about 6 hours, the operation of digestion is completed in about 4 hours.

From 6 to 8 hours of sleep are indispensable, the rule that one should go to bed early enough to wake of himself at a suitable hour in the morning.

Exercise in the morning & in open air, 2 hours walk before breakfast is as good as an hour after. - Rowing gives play to every bone & muscle of the frame, Skating is next, to rowing & Riding is best of all.
