Gentlemen:

We herewith give you rent free a license to use the real property hereinafter described for the purpose of a rifle range, which license shall be revocable on 30 days' notice, or in the event of sale of the property by us upon any notice which we deem reasonable for the purpose of permitting you to remove any improvements placed on the property.

Description: Southeast corner of Lot "B", Sub. of Lot 70 of Rancho Ex Mission, County of San Diego, State of California, approximately 3 acres.

It is understood that you will have the right to remove any improvements that you place on the property.

You will also have the right to cut the grass in an area necessary for your purposes as a rifle range and permission to trim any trees only that may be necessary to make the property available for use as a rifle range. It is understood and agreed that this permission goes only to the property which we own. It is also understood that to the extent that your range is on property other than that owned by us you will before making use of this property secure permission from the adjoining owners to use their property as a rifle range.

It is understood and agreed that this letter is a license only to use our property and we do not reserve nor do we intend to reserve the right to control the manner or way in which you use the property or operate the property other than in this letter contained. In the event, however, that any claim for injuries or damages is made or any legal action instituted by reason of the use to which the property is put you agree to save us harmless from any liability or expense in connection with the same and to pay all court costs, attorney's fees and any judgment or damages that may be



assessed against us by reason of our ownership of this property or otherwise.

It is further understood that in the event any taxes, assessments, liens or charges are assessed against any improvements which you place on the property or by reason of your use or occupancy of the same you agree to pay said charges and to save us harmless therefor.

It is further understood and agreed that you will keep said premises in orderly condition at all times and take adequate protection against any fire hazard which might be created by reason of your use of the premises and upon the termination of this license you will restore the property to us in a condition satisfactory to us.
