"CONTEMPORARY VISIONS: DRAWINGS BY ANTE MARINOVIC AND MARIO URIBE" WILL BE FEATURED BY THE UNIVERSITY ART GALLERY (MANDEVILLE GALLERY)

Individual groupings of large-scale drawings by two San Diego artists will be on view March 5 through April 2, in an exhibition titled "Contemporary Visions: Drawings by Ante Marinovic and Mario Uribe," in the University Art Gallery (formerly Mandeville Gallery), at the University of California, San Diego.

An opening reception for the artists will be held 3-5 p.m., Saturday, March 5, at the gallery. The public is invited.

The drawings of each artist reflect cultural concerns based on personal experiences and memories.

Marinovic was reared on the island of Korcula, located in the Adriatic Sea, off the coast of Bosnia-Herzegovina. For the greater part of his European career he created sculpture. His work has been commissioned for public sites by many agencies in Yugoslavia, Japan and Italy.

In recent years Marinovic has turned to drawing to express his worldview, focusing--in inky black and white--on the devastation of his native country. His graphic works have been exhibited in many of Yugoslavia's major galleries. He is represented in San Diego by the Linda Moore Gallery.

Uribe's drawings, many created recently for this exhibition, reflect transgressions in our society as perceived by the artist. Uribe's work has been exhibited in galleries and museums throughout the United States and Mexico, and in the cities of Berlin, Paris and Yokohama. His murals have been commissioned for outdoor sites in Southern California. Uribe is represented by the David Zapf Gallery in San Diego.

The University Art Gallery has free admission. The hours are from noon to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. Parking permits are required on the UCSD campus and may be purchased at the information pavilions on Gilman Drive or Northview Drive. Wheelchair access and handicapped parking are available.
