
MASTER OF NUCLEAR PHYSICS, CHEMISTRY, BIOLOGY, RADIOLOGY AND THEIR AWESOME INTERACTION. FUNDAMENTALLY CONCERNED WITH THE CONFLICT BETWEEN ORDER AND DISORDER, WHETHER IT INVOLVES THE GROWTH AND BREAKDOWN OF LIVING CELLS, OR OF LIVING CIVILIZATIONS. AMONG THE FIRST TO PERCEIVE THE THREAT AND THE PROMISE OF NUCLEAR ENERGY. WITH ENRICO FERMI AND OTHERS OF THE WORLD'S EMINENT SCIENTISTS, LABORING AGAINST TIME IN THE MANHATTAN PROJECT, DEVISES THE FIRST NUCLEAR CHAIN REACTION. SINCE THEN, CRUSADING INDEFATIGABLY TO HELP MEN UNDERSTAND HOW TO LIVE WITH THEMSELVES, AND WITH THEIR CREATIONS, IN THE ATOMIC AGE. 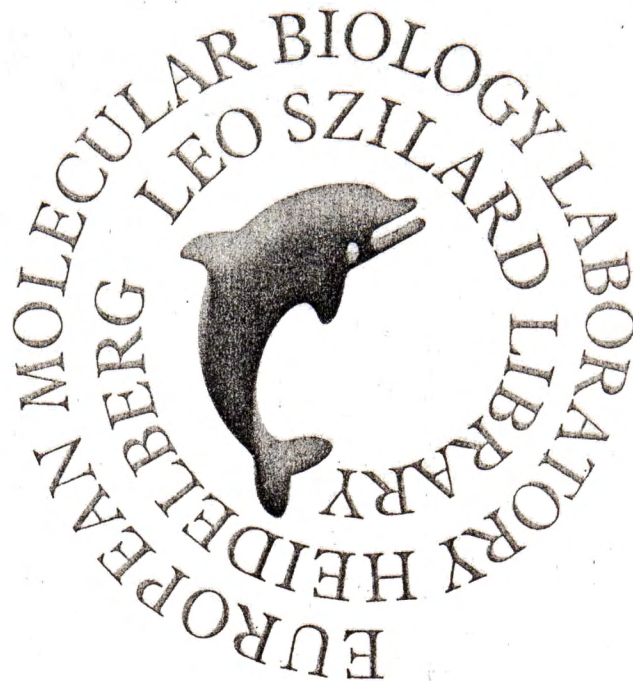
