London 14<sup>th</sup> March 1763.

I have in many of my Letters given you an Acct of the continued illness of poor Mrs Hall. We flatter'd ourselves about a fortnight ago, that she was something better, and we thought she continued for some time rather mending, but since this very cold weather has set in, she has grown worse & worse, and loses ground daily; I saw her on Friday last, but Saturday & yesterday she was too ill to see any body, and has had a very bad night; it will be impossible for her to hold it long in this way, without some very remarkable Change; for my Part, I have despaired of her these six weeks or more. Whatever happens depend upon it I will do, what I think you would wish me to do. The Girls & Boys are all perfectly well.
