

Dr. Cecil Hougie is PILS lecturer

Dr. Cecil Hougie, Professor of Pathology at the School of Medicine, University of California, San Diego, will give the fifth lecture in the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series at 4:15 p.m. on Thursday, February 6, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle College.

Dr. Hougie's topic will be "Recent Progress in Blood Clotting."

A graduate of Manchester University in England, Dr. Hougie took his residency training in pathology at the West London hospital. In 1955 he came to the United States as an instructor in pathology at the University of North Carolina and in 1956 went to the University of Virginia at Charlottesville as an associate professor of clinical pathology. In 1960 he served as an associate professor of pathology and director of clinical laboratories at the University of Washington in Seattle, where he remained until his appointment as professor at UCSD in 1968.

Dr. Hougie's research includes a study into the nature of hypercoagulable and hypocoagulable states, the physico-chemical properties of blood clotting factors and their mode of interaction, the interrelationship of blood clotting to the fibrinolytic and complement system, and the mode of action of anticoagulant and coagulant agents.

He is a member of the Western Society of Clinical Research, the Society of Experimental Pathologists, the Society of Experimental Medicine and Biology and the Editorial Board, "Survey of Pathology in Medicine and Surgery."

The lecture will be free and open to the public.
