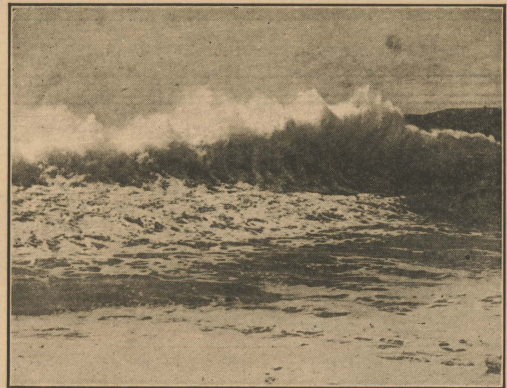

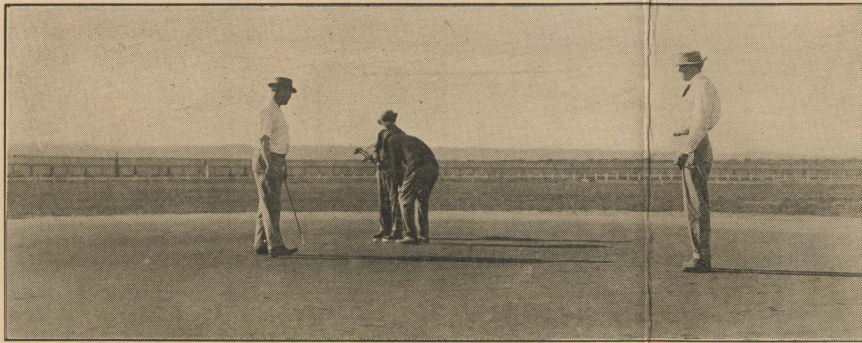

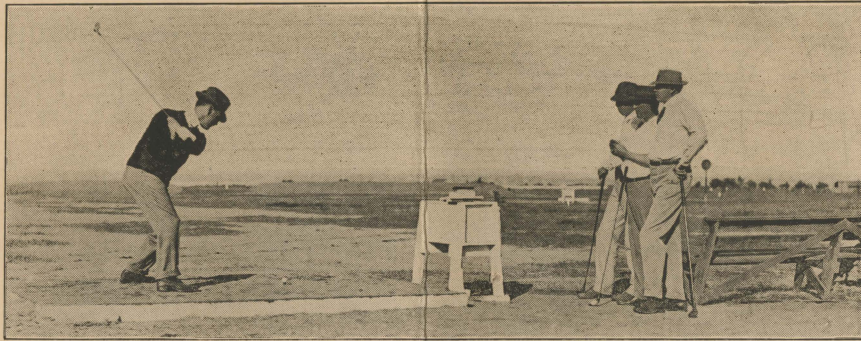

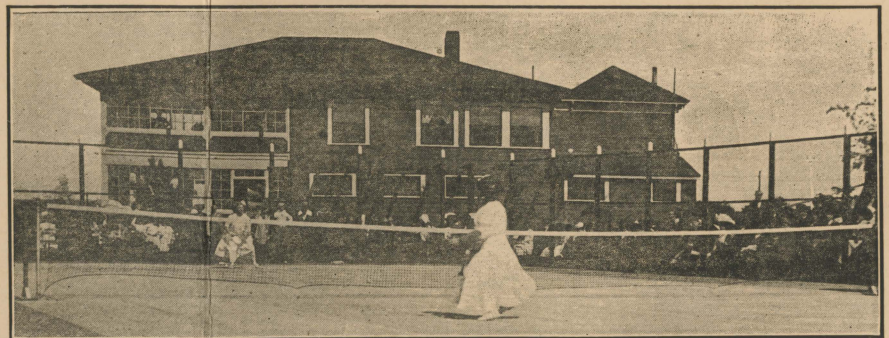

**M**ONTHLY competitions are played during the entire year for valuable cups and medals. A professional, specially engaged by the Club, has charge of the links and gives individual instruction.

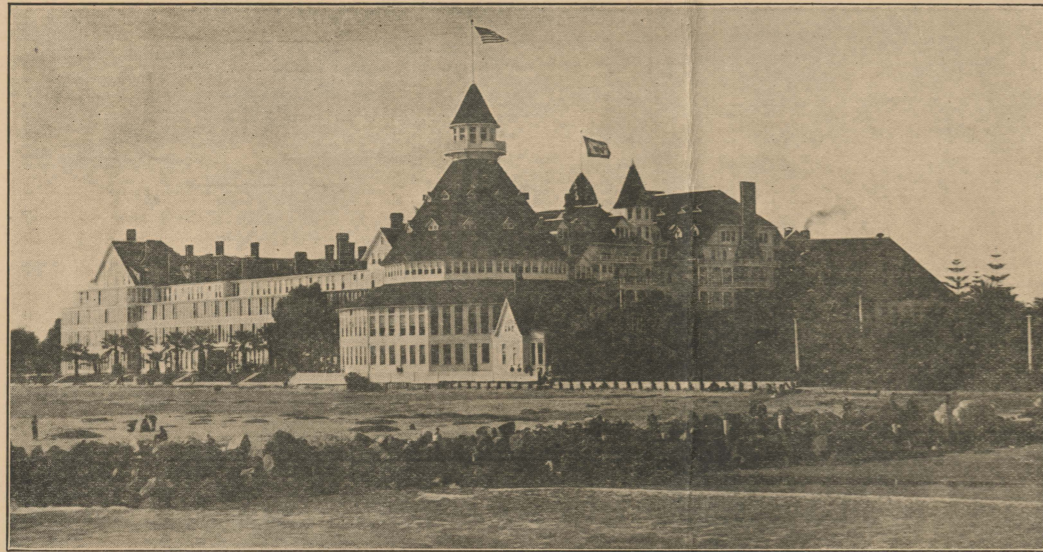

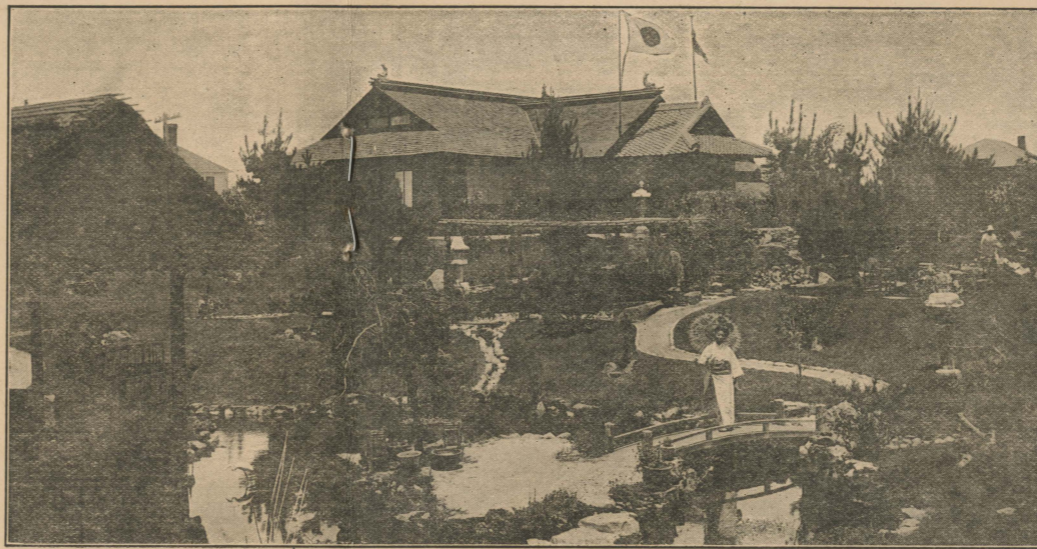

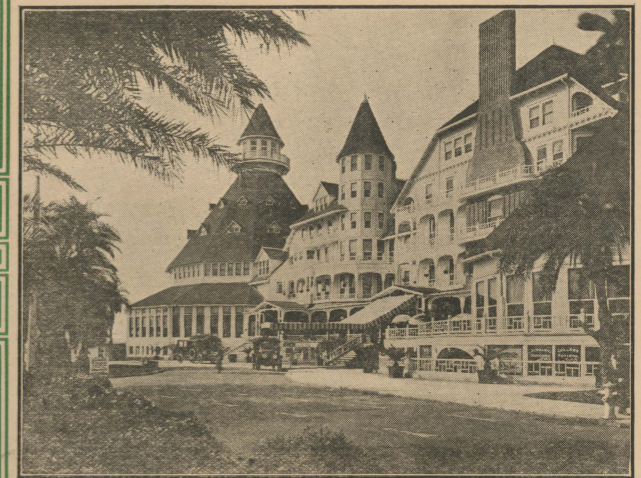

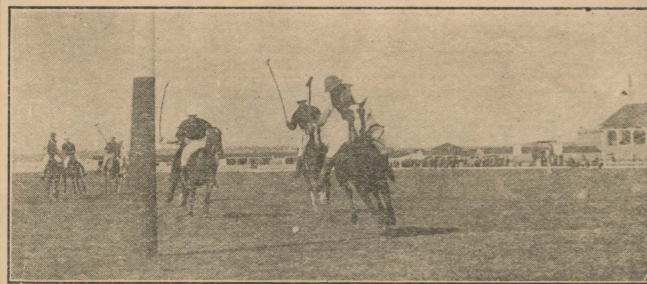

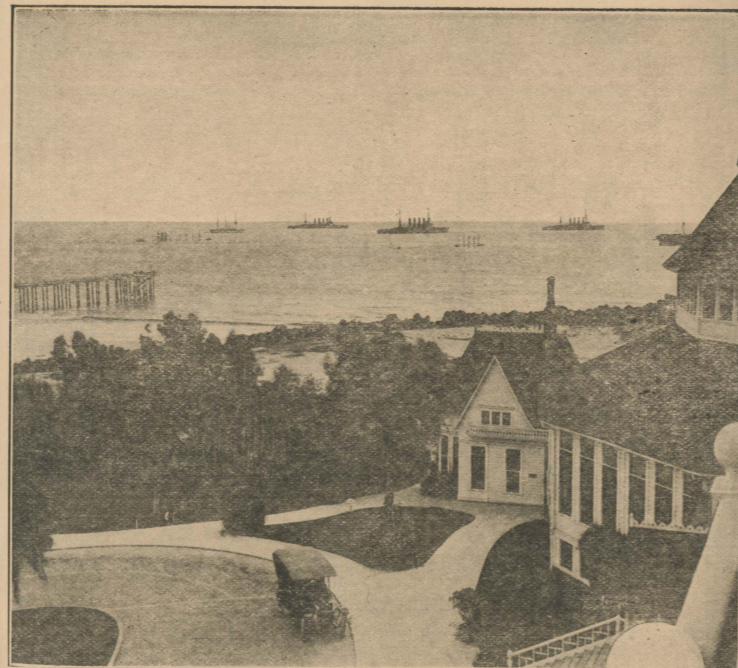

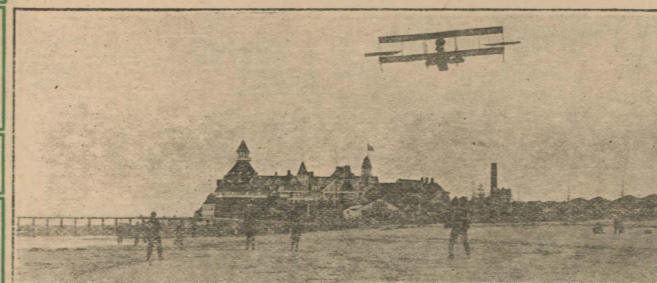

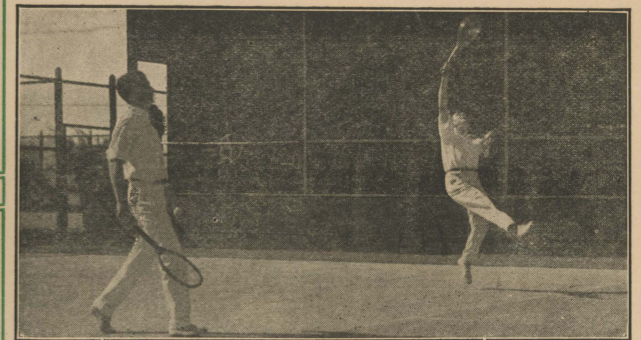

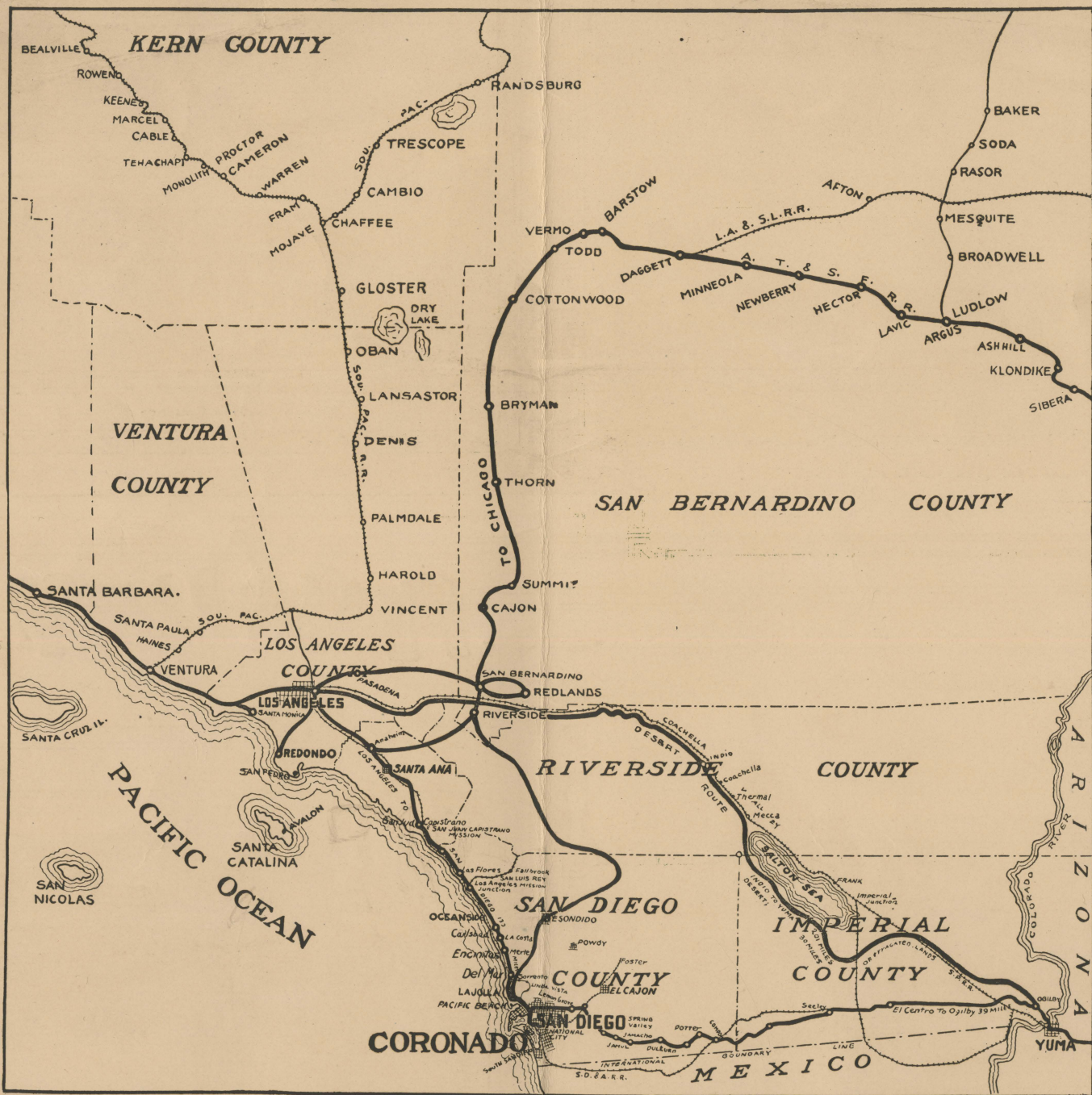

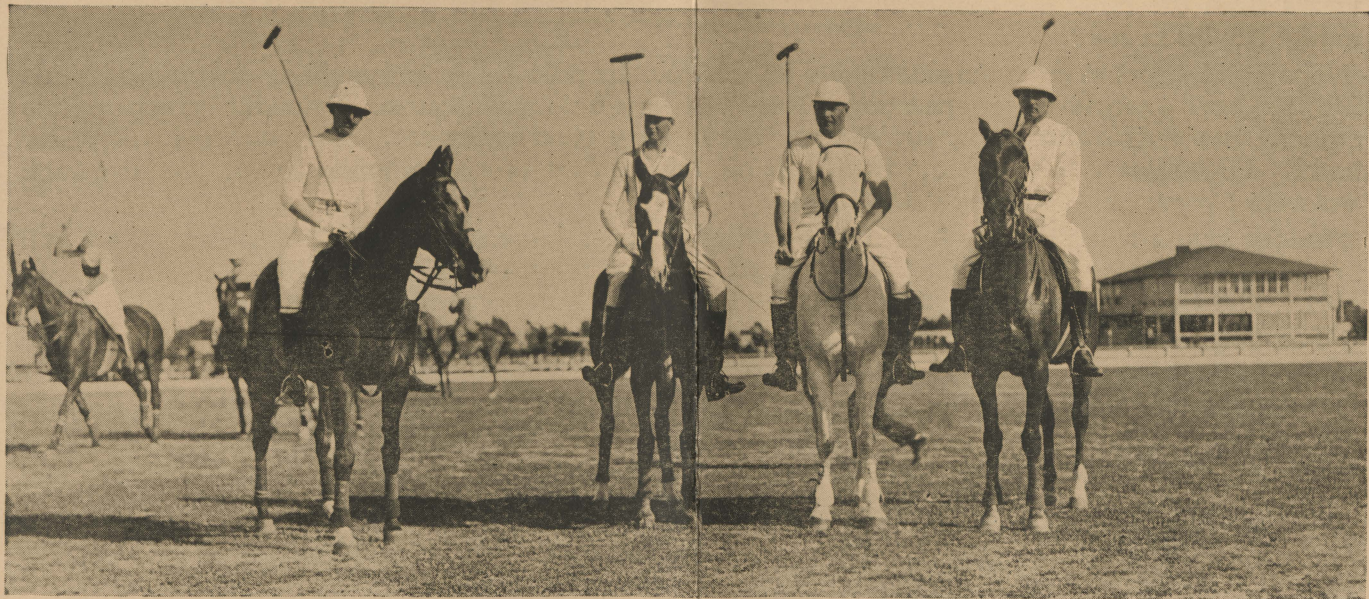

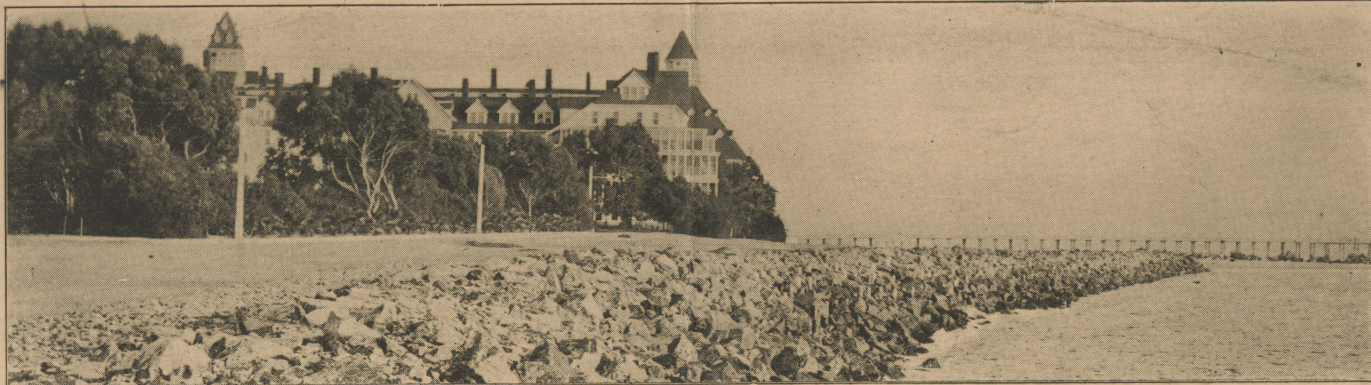
Map showing location of Coronado; also new Railroad and Automobile Road in course of construction between Yuma and San Diego---a one hundred mile cut off to the coast
