

Seymour E. Harris accepts invitation from the National Advisory Committee for the Center for the Advanced Study of Educational Administration

Seymour E. Harris, Chairman of the Department of Economics at the University of California, San Diego, is one of several prominent Americans who accepted invitations to become members of the National Advisory Committee for the Center for the Advanced Study of Educational Administration.

The Center was established this year at the University of Oregon by means of a grant of about \$2.5 million from the U.S. Office of Education. It will be devoted to basic and applied research and to improvement of educational administration and organization in the elementary, secondary, and higher educational levels.

The broad policies and goals of the Center will be established by the National Advisory Committee, consisting of outstanding representatives of education and the behavioral sciences, selected on a nationwide basis. There are twelve members.
