GORBACHEV'S SPOKESMAN TO SPEAK AT UCSD APRIL 10

Gennady Gerasimov, called by some the "voice of the Soviet Union," will speak at the University of California, San Diego at 8 p.m. Tuesday, April 10, in the Main Gym.

Gerasimov, who began his 30-year career as a journalist, served for five years in New York City as a diplomatic correspondent for the Novosti Press Agency, and was an editor for both New Times and World Marxist Review in Moscow.

Gerasimov is now the chief spokesman for U.S.S.R. President Mikhail S. Gorbachev, Chief Press Secretary for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Chief Press Secretary for the Ministry of Defense.

The author of several books, including "War and Peace in the Nuclear Age (1982), "Disarmament: Who is for, Who is Against?" (1983) and "Keep Space Weapon Free," his work has received such literary awards as the Vorovski Prize and the Golden Pen.
