

Irving Gill seminar sponsored by the Society of Architectural Historians

The designs of Irving Gill, Southern California architect at the turn of the century, will be the subject of a one-day seminar on Saturday, May 18 in La Jolla.

The seminar is being sponsored by the Society of Architectural Historians and is open to all those who share an interest in architecture professional and laymen, according to Sim Bruce Richards, AIA, coordinator for the seminar.
