

New York April 20 1776
I received a letter from Capt Brown & one from Samuel the 16th
of April by which I understand our families are well which
gives me joy I see Mr Edward Richardson this morning
he tells me you have not rec'd a letter from me since
I march'd I have sent three letters before this one of which
I left with Mr Moses Harrington at Grafton with
an order in it for Samuel to receive my Colony wages
he has used me ill in not Delivering of it to you -
I have inclosed another order for Samuel to receive my
wages I would not have him give a Receipt in full but
for the sum he may receive of the Treasurer I would
have you pay out all the money I left with you or shall
send to you except what you shall need for your own use

There is four Reg^t ordered to Quebec -
viz Col^l Doors Pattersons Grators & mine we shall
sail for Albany to day ~~and~~ we have lost two men
which have died since we came to York the Reg^t is
now much helthier then they were when we first came
here I am in good helth Leonard & Henry is well -

I have sent my horse and one Hundred Dollars ~~by~~
by Mr Dana who will Deliver them to you -
Remember me to all inquiring friends Tell Capt
Brown I had not time to write to him
