Oct 25th I received yesterday 2000 lbs Darley, hot in S. Y., for 1 1/4 - it sells here for 5c. We shall need a large quantity this year - 15 or 20 tons - and I think it is best to purchase while it is low. The lot I received yesterday was excellent - better even than Dr. Williams' and his sold readily at 5c while other kinds were selling at 4c per lb.

Oct 27th I can not send you so much money as I wished although I take all the reports about \$1000.00 - I have received no money yet from Mr. Poole, and money is really very hard to obtain here - and you must govern yourself accordingly, purchasing the most necessary articles only.

I send to D. E. Rainoud \$1000.00 & to S. G. Sargent \$600.00
 Paper & Printing \$600.00
 Total \$2200.00

It is necessary to be more careful than heretofore in purchasing goods for there is a great deal of opposition now.

Hoop opened his store with a great quantity of gas knocking Butter down to 50c Hams 20c candles 50c Walnut 25c The same kind of Oysters that Rainoud charged us at same time \$12.60 per doz he sells for \$12.50. I think Rainoud from some cause or other has latterly charged very high, & in several instances I have good reason to think he has not acted fair towards us.

I have sent my last orders to an old acquaintance of mine A. J. Chase whom I have more confidence in. I enclose his card he may have a few funds for you.

I send you the new Dollars & ten cent piece \$175.00, also your scrip. Dr. Painter is in San Francisco, has never painted signs, don't forget the Oil cloth it is the only thing that will keep fleas away, the ladies would be able to live without it, the widest & cheapest will be best.

Don't forget to purchase some barley as I shall be out before I can receive any if the present demand continues. Freight per str. Leather is \$15.00 per ton passage \$25.00. There is a large lot of Potatoes in San Diego now we shall not need many.

We have been obliged to take Bandini's Hotel
the "Gile House" or rather a part of it - it was
the only place we could obtain, you know its
arrangements I presume, well, we take three
of those small rooms in the 2^d story for bed rooms
and one room below for a parlor and dining
rooms or we can have two below one for parlor &
the other for the dining room, The kitchen is the
adobe building near the house, We pay ten dollars
per month for each room, more or less,
We have a good stove & stove furniture but I believe
every thing else is needed unless Mr. Poole, who will
write you, mentions a dinner set to be taken of buying,
Our idea is that we furnish the parlor & dining room
in common, each one furnishing his ^{beds} chamber separately
Mr. Poole has some beds room furniture - he has explained
himself fully to his wife - but as we have none, I of
course wish you to purchase for me, but nothing but
plain, common furniture, neither my means now, or
my prospects for the future will allow of any extra
- ^{part} ~~you or my~~ you now explain to the ladies that San Diego
is not the place for rich & splendid furniture,

We need all the money we can get in our business,
especially if we purchase the store stand, and I hear
to day that several persons are trying to buy it offering as
high as \$1200.00, so Raimond offered \$1000.00. Be economical.
Mr. Poole will have one very necessary piece of furniture with
which to receive his wife, on his part, a bed - but you
will have to bring bedsteads & beds as well as other furniture
with you, We have only the bare walls to ~~show~~ you, & W. M.
