


Dear Colonel Fletcher:

# TELEPHONE CALL TO BRING FREE TRANSPORTATION FOR VOTERS

A representative in each precinct prepared to give information and assign transportation to voters who wish either or both—that is the San Diego \$300,000 unemployment bond committee organization plan for election day Tuesday.

Partial listing of these precinct representatives was prepared yesterday.

"Between now and Monday night voters desiring information or transportation to the polls, may telephone our chairman in their precinct in advance," said Col. Ed Fletcher, chairman of the unemployment bond committee. "Those who will furnish cars on election day, if they wish to accept the offer of the Standard Oil company, Union Oil company, Shell Oil company and Associated Oil company can obtain, by written order from campaign headquarters, Ninth and Broadway, five gallons of gasoline.
