



EVALUATION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

- On the Friday prior to week that payroll time records are completed by the Business Office each council member shall submit a completed evaluation form to the A.S. secretary no later than 4:30 p.m.
- A schedure of "Evaluation Fridays" will be made available at the start of each quarter.
- The following Monday the ASUCSD Judicial Board shall convene and make appropriate recommendations, as follows:
- 1. In the case of paid council members, the ASUCSD Judicial Board shall decide to pay or withhold wages for the two week period ending the Friday that the Evaluation forms were completed, as per the ASUCSD Judicial Board's evaluations of the council member.
- 2. In the case of non-paid council members the Judicial Board shall evaluate those members' job performance.
- 3. When the ASUCSD Judicial Board finds the work of a council member unsatisfactory, the council member shall be established as a volunteer for those two weeks. (A volunteer shall be defined as a council member who shall continue the duties of his/her office as per his/her job description without pay.) Furthermore, the council member shall be reevaluated two weeks later and again at the normal monthly evaluation time, as per normal evaluation procedures.
- 4. Appeals on the findings of the ASUCSD Judicial Board can be initiated by any council member. Acceptance of the appeal shall be granted by a majority vote of the ASUCSD Judicial Board, which will in turn hold a special session within one week to hear the appeal.
- 5. The ASUCSD Judicial Board reserves the right to randomly audit paid council members over any given two week evaluation period. The results of these checks will be given at the appropriate meeting, and the ASUCSD Judicial Board will vote accordingly.
- 6. Council members in the event of dereliction of duty shall receive a formal written censure by the ASUCSD Judicial Board which will also be deliverred in front of council the following council meeting.
- 7. Findings of the ASUCSD Judicial Board at the conclusion of the evaluation process shall be presented to the council by the ASUCSD Judicial Board Chairperson.

It should be understood by each council member that the Judicial Board will evaluate the level and quality of work being produced and shall decide the degree of satisfactory work according to standards set forth by ASUCSD Judicial Board and ASUCSD Constitution.

- D. To give the Qualfied ASUCSD Appointee an opportunity to meet regularly with ASUCSD Council members.



ASUCSD CAMPUS FINANCIAL BY-LAWS UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AT SAN DIEGO

The following Financial By-Laws of the ASUCSD are adopted pursuant to the ASUCSD Constitution and shall supercede all previous Campus Financial By-Laws. Any expenditure of Campus Activity Fees by any branch of the ASUCSD Government be they student organization, media, ASUCSD commissioner, staff, executive or any other part must comply with all these By-Laws. These By-Laws are to be followed in accordance with "University of California Policies and U.C. San Diego Campus Regulations Applying to Campus Activities, Organizations, and Students" current edition.

ARTICLE I: THE ACTIVITY PEE

The Activity Fee shall be an eight (8) dollar fee per quarter to be paid by all undergraduate students attending UCSD. These funds are to be expended exclusively for programs and purposes which are of benefit to the entire ASUCSD Student Body.

Section A: Presidential Budget

The ASUCSD President shall present an annual budget for the following academic year for the ASUCSD to the ASUCSD Council on or before the Eighth (8) week of Spring Quarter. Any appeals to this budget must be held prior to the Tenth (10) week of the Spring Quarter.

Secton B: Mandatory Reserve

The ASUCSD shall maintain a mandatory reserve of not less than \$50,000 at all times. In addition, the ASUCSD shall add to this reserve not less than 5% of the total yearly budget.

Section C: Violation of Laws

These Activity Fees shall not be expended for programs or purposes which are in violation of state or federal laws, or of the University of California's Policies and Procedures.

Section D: Endorsement by ASUCSD

The allocation of Activity Fee funds to Student Organization(s) does not necessarily represent an endorsement or the official position of the ASUCSD, the University California, or the Regents of the University of California, in activities sponsored by that organization(s).

Section E: Non-Student Members

Because ASUCSD funds are supplied by undergraduate student fees and because the ASUCSD exists to serve undergraduate students, all ASUCSD sponsored activity groups must be composed primarily of registered students at the University of California at San Diego. Those individuals authorized to sign for budgeted expenditures must be registered students of the University and will be asked to present proof of current registration.

ARTICLE II: NON-ALLOCATIONS

Only those programs which are of general interest to the ASUCSD Student Body may be funded by the Activity Fees. The Activity Fees shall not be allocated directly or indirectly for the following items:

Section A:

Personal gain or profit.

Section B:

Scholarships.

Section C:

Payment of fines.

Section D:

The purchase of food or alcohol except for the specific purpose of ASUCSD sponsored TGIF's, and/or serving the entire ASUCSD, unless by underwrites.

Section E:

Expenses that were not approved and allocated by the ASUCSD Council prior to expenditure - this includes the use of the Executive Branch Discretionary Funds.

Section F:

Any use other than that for which the money was originally allocated for unless a reallocation request has been approved by the ASUCSD Council.

Section G:

Overtly partisan political or religious purposes as outlined in the University of California Policies and U.C. San Diego Campus Regulations Handbook, Article 32.111.

Section H:

Paying off of loans or as collateral for loans, or for the paying off of ASUCSD underwrites.

Section I:

Any travel unless it is for the purpose of representing the entire ASUCSD or if it is an advance to be paid back by University wide or UCSD Campus Administration.

Section J:

Instructors, referees or umpire fees.

Section K:

Conference registration fees unless representative of the ASUCSD.

Section L:

Uniforms or club apparel, unless by underwrite.

Section M:

Any national or professional association membership dues, unless representative of the ASUCSD.

Section N:

Any organization that is exclusive in nature including Fraternities, Sororities or Varsity or NCAA athletic teams, or maintains exclusivity in either its membership or events.

ARTICLE III: EXECUTIVE DISCRETIONARY ACCOUNTS

Section A:

The ASUCSD Council can provide for a discretionary account by a simple majority vote of a quorum of the ASUCSD Council.

Section B:

The Executive Branch must, within seven (7) academic days, present and report to the ASUCSD Council on how any discretionary funds were used. At the Council's discretion the amount allocated can be returned to the Executive Account from the unallocated reserve.

ARTICLE IV: ACTIVITY FRE BOARD

The Activity Fee Board shall be the Board for all student organization requests with the exception of Media, which shall go to the Media Board for funds, and those organizations included in the President's annual budget.

Section A:

The Activity Fee Board shall consist of eight (8) members.

 Activity Fee Board Chair ("Chair"), who is the Vice President: Financial of ASUCSD. The Chair will vote only in the case of a tie.

- 2. Two (2) at large appointments selected by the Chair with the Vice President: Administrative, and approved by a simple majority vote of a quorum of Council.
- 3. One (1) representative from each college selected by their respective College Councils to serve as a member of the Activity Fee Board. Each College Council shall appoint their representative to the Board by the Second week of the New Council term. If a College Council declines to appoint a representative the Activity Fee Chair with the Commissioner of Appointments and Evaluations may choose a representative from, and for the specific college.
- 4. The ASUCSD Financial Controller shall be an ex-officio member of the Board for advisory purposes.

Section B:

The Activity Fee Board shall assume the responsibility of informing each student organization of these By-Laws.

Section C: Budget Requests

Budget requests from registered student organizations shall follow the following procedures:

- 1. Student organizations shall request funding for the quarter before Friday of the Eighth (8) week of the previous quarter.
- Public hearings regarding these requests shall be scheduled and held during Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of the Ninth (9) week of the quarter.
- 3. Recommended allocations will be presented to the ASUCSD Council for approval Wednesday of the Tenth (10) week of the quarter.
- 4. The Activity Fee Board shall provide appeal hearings during the Monday and Tuesday of the Tenth (10) week of the quarter.
- 5. The Activity Fee Board may consider any groups desiring funds at any time during the academic year under emergency funding requests. These requests must be for an activity that was unforseeable and is an exception to the normal request procedure. The Activity Fee Board shall report these budget requests to the ASUCSD Council for approval.

Section D:

The Activity Fee Board shall meet regularly at a time announced at the ASUCSD Council meetings. A report of each meeting is to be provided to the ASUCSD Vice-President: Administrative for inclusion in the Agenda Packet for the next ASUCSD Council meeting.

Section E:

The Activity Fee Board shall review any student organization budget at their request within five (5) days of that student organization's request.

ARTICLE V: STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS/ALLOCATION REQUESTS

Section A:

To qualify to become a student organization all clubs must:

- 1. File a registration packet
 - a. part "A" and part "B"
 - b. constitution and/or by-laws
- Submit copies (2) of a constitution and/or by-laws to be kept on file with the Student Activities Office and the Activity Fee Chair.

Section B:

All student organizations requesting funds from the ASUCSD shall have been registered as a student organization for one quarter before receiving funding.

Section C:

Only those four (4) principal members listed on the registration form shall be eligible to request and spend Campus Activity Fee allocations for that student organization.

Section D:

All allocations requested by student organizations shall be made for one of the following purposes:

- 1. Operating expenses, which will provide the general operation and functioning of the student organization.
- 2. Program expenses, which will provide for programs designed to serve the general student interest.

Section E:

Funding of events shall <u>require a minimum of two (2) weeks</u> advance approval by the Activity Fee Board.

Section F:

All budget requests shall be presented to the Activity Fee Chair OR the Student Activities Administrative Assistant. Student organization requests must have approval signature of the student organizations' Program Advisor, in order to be heard by the Activity Fee Board. Requests not approved or signed may still be heard by the Activity Fee Chair.

Section G:

All requests under \$250.00 require the approval of the Activity Fee Chair, or a simple majority vote of a quorum of the Activity Fee Board. If for any reason an allocation is questioned, the allocation request may be brought before Council for final approval. All appeals shall be presented to the Activity Fee Chair within seven (7) days of allocation decision. The Chair who shall present the appeal to the ASUCSD Council for their consideration at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the ASUCSD Council. These allocations of less than \$250.00 shall be itemized and reported to the ASUCSD Council on a monthly basis.

ARTICLE VI: ASUCSD ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES

The following procedures for accounting shall be followed by all student organizations, media, ASUCSD commissioners, staff, and executives. Any violations of these accounting procedures shall result in freezing of all funds to the specific group, and possible loss of all funding rights.

Section A:

All Activity Fee allocations shall be subject to normal ASUCSD and University of California business and accounting procedures.

Section B:

All funds allocated by the ASUCSD shall remain within the ASUCSD Business Office and kept on the books within the ASUCSD offices. The accounts will be maintained by the ASUCSD Bookkeeper in the following manner:

1. Allocated funds to be spent according to specific line items.

Section C:

Outside accounts of private non-University funds, may be held in the name of the organization. The ASUCSD maintains the right to audit these accounts at any time. Financial Statements regarding the outside accounts shall be regularly filed with the ASUCSD Business Office.

Section D:

All deposits to a specific account must be made out to the "Regents of the University of California" for deposit in the student organization's account.

Section E:

If funds allocated by the ASUCSD to a student organization are overspent, the amount overspent shall be paid back from the student organization's agency account or by the four (4) principle members listed on the registration form.

Section F:

The ASUCSD reserves the right to withdraw funding and/or affiliation in the event that a group violates any ASUCSD policy, in accordance with due process principles as set forth in the University of California Policies and U.C. San Diego Campus Regulations. It is the responsibility of the four (4) principle members to become familiar with all UCSD Policies regarding student organizations and activities.

Section G:

Any funds allocated and not spent for the specific line item request shall automatically be returned to Student Organizations Unallocated within one (1) week after the date of the program.

ARTICLE VII: REALLOCATION REQUESTS

Section A: Council Budgets

All reallocations of allocated Activity Fee to Council members accounts must be approved by a simple majority of quorum of the ASUCSD Council.

Section B: Student Organization Budgets

Student organization reallocation requests must be made to the Activity Fee Board.

- 1. All reallocation requests for less than \$250.00 require the approval of a simple majority vote of a quorum of the Activity Fee Board OR the approval of the Activity Fee Chair.
- 2. All reallocation requests greater than \$250.00 shall be presented to the Activity Fee Board for consideration. Approval requires a simple majority of a quorum of the Activity Fee Board OR the approval of a simple majority vote of a quorum of the ASUCSD Council.

ARTICLE VIII: UNDERWRITES/SUBSIDIES

Section A:

Underwrites shall be a sanctioned loan by the ASUCSD Council to one of their affiliates.

Section B:

Subsidies shall be loans to an organization/group that shall be paid back in an amount determined by the Activity Fee Board. Any amount not paid back, under agreement with the Activity Fee Board, will be treated as an allocation to the organization.

Campus Financial By-Laws Page Eight

Section C:

The ASUCSD Council can underwrite/subsidize any event by a favorable simple majority vote of a quorum of the ASUCSD Council.

Section D:

All underwrites must be paid back in full.

- 1. Any entity using an underwrite must sign a waiver indicating the intention to pay back the loan in full within sixty (60) calendar days or the end of Spring Quarter, whichever comes first.
- 2. All student organizations must, within ten (10) days of expending an underwrite, provide a report to the Activity Fee Chair detailing how the money was used. If a student organization fails to provide a report, funding privileges may be lost.

Section E:

In the case of a student organization not paying back an underwrite, any monies remaining in the agency accounting of the deliquent student organization, shall be used to pay back the underwrite or the amount shall be paid back by the four (4) principal members listed on the registration form.

ARTICLE IX: FUNDRAISING

Section A:

All requests to the ASUCSD, to finance fundraising events, must be by an underwrite.

Section B:

All funds being raised must be defined and be consistent with the stated purposes of the sponsoring organization.

Section C:

All organizations raising funds must use tickets at the events. All ticket sales must be conducted through the Student Center Box Office. A completed financial statement <u>must</u> then be filed with the ASUCSD Business Office within 48 hours of the event.

Section D:

Registered student organizations may raise funds through their membership through collection of dues and/or initiation fees.

Section E:

If a charge is required for admission to an event, it may not be called or publicized as a "donation". Implication that a donation is a requirement for admission to an event is prohibited.

Section F:

The ASUCSD reserves the right to audit or investigate the financial records of registered student organizations using University properties to raise funds.

ARTICLE X: FREEZING

Section A:

In the event any entity within the ASUCSD attempts to circumvent, overspend, misappropriate, or for any purpose violate any of these Campus Financial By-Laws, their account shall be subject to being frozen.

Section B:

In the event a student organization account is subject to being frozen, the Activity Fee Board Chair OR a simple majority of a quorum of the Activity Fee Board OR a simple majority of a quorum of the ASUCSD Council, OR the ASUCSD President, may freeze that student organization account.

Section C:

In the event any other entity account funded by the ASUCSD is subject to being frozen, a simple majority vote of a quorum of Council OR the ASUCSD President OR a simple majority vote of a quorum of the Finance Committee may freeze that account.

Section D:

In the event an account is frozen it must be reviewed by the ASUCSD Finance Committee within seven (7) academic days from date of notice that account was frozen. This action must be presented to the ASUCSD Council for final approval at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

ARTICLE XI: AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws can be amended at any time by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of a quorum of the ASUCSD Council.

- 3) Institutions where funds are invested must have a net worth to liabilities ration over 3% (Federal Government definition of solvency).
- 4) Term of investment may not exceed six months.

SPECIFIC FINANCIAL RESTRICTIONS

- 1) All unbudgeted funds are eligible for investment
- 2) Three signatures will be required for all account investments and withdrawls, including the signature of one U.C. administrator.

INVESTMENT STRUCTURE

- 1) An Investment Committee consisting of the A.S. Controller, President, Advisor, and one U.C. Administrator will oversee all investments.
- 2) Monthly reports must be made as to the status of investments, returns on those investments, and expectations of future investments.
