UCSD TO HOST "VAUDEVILLE NOUVEAU," A MIX OF ACROBATICS, JUGGLING, SIGHT GAGS AND FAST-PACED PATTERN, MAY 16

Two zany performers who identify themselves as "Vaudeville Nouveau" will bring their particular brand of rapid-fire comedy-juggling to the Mandeville Auditorium at 8 p.m. May 16, at the University of California, San Diego.

Tickets are \$10 for general admission, \$6 for students and \$8 for seniors, and may be purchased at the UCSD Box Office and from TicketMaster outlets. Group rates are available: call 534-6467.

In a 90-minute show, the duo brings a touch of old vaudeville to the stage, with a whole new slant. Danny Mankin and Mark Sackett juggle clubs, rings, scarves, bowling balls and each other, all the while maintaining the stage personas they have invented for themselves.

Mankin is Dr. Danny Daniels, the long-winded "expert" and Sackett is the slightly spaced-out Ludwig. Mankin apprenticed with the San Francisco Mime Troupe and was one of the originators of the juggling group The Bay City Reds. He has appeared in the Olympic Arts Festival and on national television. Sackett began performing as a musician before crossing over to circus and theatre. His theatre training includes the American Conservatory Theatre, the Berkeley Stage Company and the California Conservatory Theatre.
