UCSD PUBLIC FORUM ON RECENT CHANGES IN SOVIET UNION SET FOR OCT. 29

A free public forum on "The New Soviet Union and the New World Order" will be held Tuesday, Oct. 29 at 7 p.m. at the University of California, San Diego's Graduate School of International Relations and Pacific Studies (IR/PS) Robinson Auditorium.

The forum, sponsored by UCSD's Project in International and Security Affairs (PISA) and IR/PS, will feature a panel discussion of UCSD experts who will discuss the latest transformations in the Soviet political landscape and the implications for international security and foreign and economic relations.

The panel, to be moderated by Susan Shirk, acting director of the University of California's Institute on Global Conflict and Cooperation (IGCC) and a professor at IR/PS, will include: IR/PS Dean Peter Gourevitch, who will discuss the dramatic political changes in the world order; IR/PS Professor Peter Cowhey, who will explain the implications for the international economic system; Herbert York, director emeritus of IGCC, a renowned authority on international security issues; and UCSD political scientist and Soviet specialist Phillip Roeder. After a panel presentation, the speakers will field questions from the public.

Parking permits are required for evening events at UCSD, and can be purchased for \$2.00 at the Gilman and Northview Drive entrances to the campus.
