

Donald Erb, Cleveland Institute of Music composer will discuss recent compositions

Donald Erb, composer in residence at the Cleveland Institute of Music, will discuss recent compositions at a noon lecture at the University of California, San Diego on Tuesday, February 16. The event will take place in the Recital Hall, Building 409, Matthews Campus, and is free and open to the public.

Mr. Erb's works have been performed by nearly all of the major orchestras in the United States. Several of his pieces have been commissioned by the Detroit and Dallas Symphonies, and the Dallas Symphony has recorded three of his pieces.

His most recent work, a piece for rock band and symphony orchestra, "Moog Synthesizer," was tailored specifically to the unusual capabilities of the Detroit Symphony, which has within the orchestra a rock ensemble called "The Symphonic Metamorphosis."
