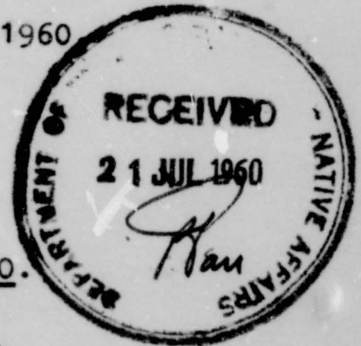

INTRODUCTION

The object of this report is to detail the actual days spent on patrol while supervising work on the north coast road and collecting tax from the plantations in the Wakunai area.

DIARY

- 3rd. May Proceeded TEARAKA via road sites 1,2,3 & 4. In afternoon supervised work on Red River-Nupatore section.
- 4th. May Proceeded to Asitawi-Balisotore section then walked to Wakunai via Wakunai River bridge site.
- 20th. May Proceeded to Tenekau Plantation to collect Tax. Returned to Wakunai in afternoon.
- 21st. May Proceeded to Numa Numa Plantation to collect Tax. Returned to Wakunai in afternoon.
- 29th. May. Proceeded to TEARAKA by canoe. Slept TEARAKA.
- 30th. May. By canoe to TEIHUP then walked via TOKAI to KOTOITA. Slept KOTOITA.
- 31st. May. Proceeded Inus Plantation to collect Tax. Slept Inus.
- 1st. June A.M. Heard complaints and disputed at Inus. P.M. Walked to TEIHUP via KOTOITA and TOKAI. Slept TEIHUP.
- 2nd. June Proceeded to TEARAKA and inspected Red River-Nupatore section of road.
- 3rd. June Proceeded Nupatore and above and inspected proposed road to the old village of PUKOIA. Returned and inspected branch road to PIPIPAIA. Slept TEARAKA.
- 4th. June Returned to Wakunai by canoe.

DIARY Cont.

- 17th June. Proceeded to Arigua Plantation to collect Tax.
Slept Arigua.
- 18th June. To Kurwina Plantation to collect tax. Returned
via Tenekau Plantation to Wakunai.

Plantation Tax

A total of £1,570 was collected from the five (5) plantations and there were no incidents concerning payment.

Exemptions 188457 to 188566 were granted.

Road Work

Work started on the four(4) sections of the north coast road on Monday 2nd. May, and since then the people have been working every alternate fortnight. The four sections i.e. Wakunai-Wakunai River, Wakunai River-Asitavi, Asitavi-Bulisotoro and Red River-Nupatoro have all had police supervision however it has not been found necessary to do any more than just guide the work. The people are enthusiastic about the whole road programme and have been working well.

The four sections, on an average working day, would have about 700 labourers from SIBOKIPALA, MAPRANO, TIAKON (Section 1.) LESIOPALA, SISIVI, RURUVU, TOGARAU, IRU (Section 2.) TUTUPALA, BULISOTORO, KAKARAPALA (Section 3.) TSUNAKY KUSI, SIRINIA, OSIWAIPA, ONOWAIPA, NUPATORO, PIPIPAIA, TEARAKA, POKOLA (Section 4.) There have been two branch roads started from Section 4. The people of PIPIPAIA have branched off towards their village and the people from TEARAKA are working towards the Aita River.

Section 1. has now been completed and the people from the three villages concerned are now working to build a ford across the Wakunai River which will serve as a temporary measure until the Wakunai River bridge is built.

Section 2 has now almost linked up with the Asitavi Sawmill road and it should be only a matter of weeks before traffic is able to travel between Wakunai and Asitavi.

Section 3 is proceeding steadily but there is still much work to be done before BULISOTORO is reached. This section may be speeded up when the present labourers are joined by the people from IRU

who will be able to leave Section 2 when it is completed.

Section 4, which has now reached NUPATORO, is a credit to the Aita people who have been working enthusiastically and well. This section will eventually be built further up the ridge from NUPATORO but at the present time the main body of workers will be divided between the two branch sections, i.e. to PIPIPAIA and to the Aita River.

- 29th. May. Proceeded to TEARAKA by canoe. Slept TEARAKA.
- 30th. May. By canoe to TEIHUP then walked via TOKAI to KOTOITA. Slept KOTOITA.
- 31st. May. Proceeded Inus Plantation to collect Tax. Slept Inus.
- 1st. June A.M. Heard complaints and disputed at Inus. P.M. Walked to TEIHUP via KOTOITA and TOKAI. Slept TEIHUP.
- 2nd. June Proceeded to TEARAKA and inspected Red River-Nupatore section of road.
- 3rd. June Proceeded Nupatore and above and inspected proposed road to the old village of POKDIA. Returned and inspected branch road to PIPIPAIA. Slept TEARAKA.
- 4th. June Returned to Wakumai by canoe.

17th June.

Proceeded to Arigua Plantation to collect Tax.
Slept Arigua.

18th June.

To Furvina Plantation to collect tax. Returned
via Tenakau Plantation to Wakunai.

Plantation Tax

A total of £1,579 was collected from the five (5)
plantations and there were no incidents concerning payment.

Exemptions 133457 to 133566 were granted.

Road Work

Work started on the four(4) sections of the north
coast road on Monday 2nd. May, and since then the people have been
working every alternate fortnight. The four sections i.e. Wakunai-
Wakunai River, Wakunai River-Asitavi, Asitavi-Bulisotoro and Red River-
Nupatoro have all had police supervision however it has not been found
necessary to do any more than just guide the work. The people are

KAKARAPALIA (Section 3.) TSUBIAKI KUSI, KIRIBIA, OSIWALPA, ONOWAIPA,
NUPATORO, PIPIPALIA, TEARAKA, PEKOIA (Section 4.) There have been two
branch roads started from Section 4. The people of PIPIPALIA have
branched off towards their village and the people from TEARAKA are
working towards the Aita River.

Section 1. has now been completed and the people
from the three villages concerned are now working to build a ford
across the Wakunai River which will serve as a temporary measure until
the Wakunai River bridge is built.

Section 2 has now almost linked up with the Asitavi
Sawmill road and it should be only a matter of weeks before traffic is
able to travel between Wakunai and Asitavi.

Section 3 is proceeding steadily but there is still
much work to be done before BULISOTORO is reached. This section may be
speeded up when the present labourers are joined by the people from IBU

who will be able to leave Section 2 when it is completed.

Section 4, which has now reached NUPATORO, is a credit to the Aita people who have been working enthusiastically and well. This section will eventually be built further up the ridge from NUPATORO but at the present time the main body of workers will be divided between the two branch sections, i.e. to PIPIPAIA and to the Aita River.
