

Board of Admissions and Relations with Schools to meet at UCSD (University-wide board)

May 11, 1965

The University of California board, charged with formulating the overall policy of admissions for the University's nine campuses, is scheduled to meet on the San Diego campus Thursday and Friday, May 13 and 14.

The seven-member Board of Admissions and Relations with Schools will convene at 10:00 a.m. Thursday in room 2129, Bonner Hall at UCSD. The board members, each representing one of the seven campuses of the University now in operation, will be joined by Frank L. Kidner, University Dean of Educational Relations; Howard B. Shontz, University-wide Director of Admissions; Dr. Vern Robinson, University-wide Director of Relations with Schools; the Campus Admission Officers and their staffs; and the staffs from the Office of Educational relations and the Office of Relations with Schools.

The Board of Admissions and Relations with Schools is a standing committee of the University-wide Academic Senate made up of one faculty member from each campus. The San Diego campus is represented by Dr. Andrew H. Wright, Professor of English Literature.

According to Mr. John Brown, UCSD Admissions Officer, the board has the job of formulating the overall policy of admissions and relations with schools for the University. It is then up to Dean Kidner and his staff to execute this policy, he said.

Brown said the board and the various staff members will spend two days working on the problems of ever increasing enrollment at the University, coordinating the admission activities on all of the campuses, and explaining the University-wide operations to the public.

On Thursday, following the morning work session, the board members will gather at a Chancellor's luncheon. That evening a reception will be held at the home of Dr. and Mrs. Wright. On Friday, following the morning work session, a no-host box lunch will be held in the conference room at the Institute of Geophysics and Planetary Physics.
