AWARDS AND HONORS

Two members of the Department of Literature at the University of California, San Diego, have received recent honors. They are:

Louis Montrose, professor of literature at UCSD, was named as one of 158 national recipients of the prestigious Guggenheim Fellowship awards. He was cited for his work on Elizabethan representations of the relationship between subjects and the state. Montrose brings to 133 the number of UCSD faculty named as Guggenheim Fellows.

Ronald Berman, professor of literature, has been awarded the Elizabeth Agee prize for his book, The Great Gatsby and Fitzgerald's World of Ideas, honored as the best book on American Literature accepted by the University of Alabama Press in 1995. He also has been appointed the West Coast Regional Director of the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation committee on fellowships for humanistic studies.
