DANCE GROUP MOMIX WILL APPEAR FOR ONE NIGHT ONLY AT UCSD--OCTOBER 13

An evening of dance by Momix, the dance group named after a milk supplement for veal calves, will take place at 8 p.m. October 13, in the Mandeville Center Auditorium, at the University of California, San Diego.

Momix is a spin-off the Pilobolus dance troupe (named for a light-sensitive fungus). It originated as a dance solo for the 1980 winter olympics by the group's founder and director, Moses Pendleton. Until 1983, Momix consisted of Pendleton and Alison Chase who spun off the Pilobolus group to tour the United States.

Today, audiences have come to recognize Momix as an energetic dance company, known for their athletic choreography. They combine dance, mime and gymnastics, along with stylized lighting design, to bring a highly visual experience to the viewer.

The company has toured worldwide and has been active in film and video. Momix has appeared in several commercials for Japanese television and has created video and slide presentations for their own performances. Recent projects include a U.S. tour with the band Shadowfax, and debut performances in Sweden and Denmark.

Momix is brought to San Diego by UCSD University Events. Tickets are available from the UCSD Box Office, (534-4559) or from TicketMaster outlets. General admission is \$17, seniors, \$15, and students, \$12.
