

Dr. Andrew Wright addresses Friends of the Library

Dr. Andrew Wright, professor of literature at the University of California, San Diego, will address the Friends of the UCSD Library at 8:00 p.m. on Monday, November 25.

Dr. Wright's topic will be "Jane Austen as a Foreigner." He is a well-known Austen scholar and has published a book about her works, Jane Austen's Novels; A Study in Structure. This work has been republished several times. He also edited her Persuasion and Northanger Abbey.

Dr. Wright's interest in William Blake's books and art work has resulted in an important collection of Blake's works in the UCSD Library. He has published critical editions of Walpole's works and is the joint author of a selective bibliography of English and American literature.

Dr. Wright received his A.B. from Harvard University and his Ph.D. from the Ohio State University in 1951. he was professor of English at Ohio State University before coming to UCSD and has received two Fulbright Fellowships to University College in London, as well as several other grants. He is a member of numerous societies, including the Jane Austen Society.

Dr. Wright has been a long-time member of the Friends of the Library and has served as its vice president during the past year.
