

Dr. Moira Roth lectures on "Contemporary Women's Art: Visions and Re-Visions" continuing the "Adventures in Research" series

Associate professor of visual arts Dr. Moira Roth will discuss "Contemporary Women's Art: Visions and Re-Visions" Wednesday, April 22, in the second "Adventures in Research" lecture of the spring quarter at the University of California, San Diego.

Her illustrated talk will be given at noon in Conference Room 111A in the Administrative Complex. The public is invited and admission is free.

The "Adventures in Research" lectures are a continuing series designed to acquaint members of the campus community and the public with current faculty research at the university.

The British-born Roth earned her Ph.D. at the University of California, Berkeley and joined the UC San Diego faculty in 1974. From 1974 until 1976 she served as the director of the UC San Diego Mandeville Center Art Gallery.
