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BEAUTIFUL LA JOLLA, "The Jewel of the Pacific Coast, the Capri of America," fourteen miles north of San Diego, has been selected as the home of the "Casa de Mañana," a new resort hotel.

Absolutely no expense has been spared in making the Casa de Mañana the "jewel" of all the many fine Pacific Coast all-year-round resort hotels, and a credit to its exquisite setting.

Upon entering Casa de Mañana, one finds a beautiful big

lounge luxuriously furnished with deep divans, many comfortable cushioned chairs, artistic lamps, and several old Italian red lacquer cabinets which add distinction and charm to the room.

The dining room, sun parlor and writing rooms, each furnished with the same careful attention as to appointment, are correspondingly attractive, while in the center of the hotel is the tiled patio, with wrought-iron balconies and center pool, where one can bask in the wonderful Southern California sunshine away from the direct ocean breeze, or enjoy a meal in the open air.

Every bedroom in the Casa de Mañana has a private bath and

two large closets, with furniture and hangings to harmonize with the prevailing color scheme throughout.

There are many and varied amusements available for the guests of Casa de Mañana. In ten minutes from the hotel one can reach an exceptionally fine 18-hole golf course, ideally situated on a high plateau overlooking La Jolla and the ocean, every hole of which has been carefully planned to arouse the golfer's interest. From every tee the player gets a new and gorgeous view of the ever-changing ocean—with famous Old Baldy, snow-capped, in the distance—an inspiration for a long drive.


TIMIN LITTRAITEL

Six excellent tennis courts—two of which are on the hotel grounds—are available to those who prefer tennis. Again, within ten minutes from the hotel, there is a splendid riding academy equipped with excellent horses. There are bridle paths in the mountains close by, or interesting rides along the beach beneath the cliffs

The perfectly equipped Casino and bathing beach are only one block from the hotel, while half an hour's motor run takes one to beautiful Balboa Park where excellent concerts are conducted every day. LOUNGE

Points of interest are many. The wonder caves of the Coast are located at La Jolla, and the Scripps Biological Institute is always a source of interest, while Gold Fish Point, with its amazingly blue waters and gold fish swimming about below, is a very unusual sight.


