UCSD ECONOMICS PROFESSOR MARK MACHINA ELECTED FELLOW OF ECONOMETRIC SOCIETY

UCSD economics professor Mark Machina has been elected a Fellow of The Econometric Society, a distinguished international society for the advancement of economic theory in its relation to statistics and mathematics.

An expert on economic theory and decision making under uncertainty, Machina has been a member of the UCSD faculty since 1979. He has published in numerous academic journals, including Econometrica, Science, and the Journal of Economic Theory. He is also an active member of several professional associations, such as the American Economic Association and the Royal Economic Society.

Machina's election as a Fellow is in recognition of his original contributions to economic science.

The recipient of numerous honors, fellowships and grants, Machina has taught economics at the People's University of China at Beijing, University of Cambridge and at Princeton University. He was also a Fellow at Stanford University's Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences and a visiting scholar at Columbia University's Graduate School of Business and at Australian National University.
