

"Pacific Vibrations" surf film presented by club here

"Pacific Vibrations," a full-length, color surfing film produced not just for surfers but for anyone who loves the ocean, will be shown at 8:30 p.m. Saturday, November 13, in the University of California, San Diego Gymnasium.

The film showing is sponsored by the UCSD Surfing Club. Admission is \$1.50 for the general public and \$1.00 for UCSD students.

"Pacific Vibrations" was made by John Severson, former publisher of Surfing Magazine and a well known surfer in his own right. The movie, currently being shown in several commercial movie houses, is not just for surfers but has enough film and story merit to be of interest to non-surfers. It is a documentary that evolves around surfing and ecology, including the ocean, ocean life, the beaches, and the people who use them.

Proceeds of the movie will go toward helping the UCSD Surfing Club attend out of city meets and to supply boards and wet suits for interested students who don't have them.
