GRADUATE SCIENCE STUDENTS ARE HONORED BY ARCS FOUNDATION

Ten graduate students at the University of California, San Diego, will receive scholarships of approximately \$5,000 each from the San Diego Chapter of ARCS Foundation, Inc., during an annual scholarships awards luncheon Nov. 12.

Also receiving scholarships to complete graduate degrees will be nine students from San Diego State University.

ARCS (Achievement Rewards for College Scientists) is a nonprofit national organization founded in 1958 by a group of women concerned about the high cost of education and U.S. supremacy in the technological race. It is committed to educationally assisting the best and brightest American graduate students seeking advanced degrees in natural sciences, medicine and engineering.

Since its founding in 1986 the San Diego Chapter of ARCS has raised over \$352,000 for scholarships.
