## Dear Pauline,

I have finally arrived at what to do for your piece in Providence. Rather than make a direct analog to the musicians' activity, I would like to do a realization of a new piece of my own which is, in a way, itself a realization of your piece. The Media Sculptures: MAPS OF SPACF 41 and "? which are enclosed, were engendered by WHE FIAMING INDIAN, the visual name of your group and the Seven Mile Bridge to Key West.

For the performance in April (?) I want to do a version of \#2 involving the transformation of a single image/environment through the addition of layers of the same image having certain alterations and reinforcements of shapes. (The layers can be regarded as episodes of time). The image will come from trips to Providence. The medium, I think, will be slide projections. It will be a slow, gradual process and nothing in particular will result.

The sculptures can take many forms from purely conceptual or imaginary to elaborately physical and are, I think--ahd hope you agree--an interesting complement to the Sonic Meditations.
