

UCSD Black Drama Association will present program 8/10/73

The University of California, San Diego Black Drama Association will present a program of drama, poetry, music and dance Friday, Aug. 10.

The show, which is free and open to the public, will be held at 8:30 p.m. in Room 2100 of the Basic Science Bldg., School of Medicine.

Included in the program will be a scene from "Pearlie Victorious," spirituals, African drummers and two original skits.

Purpose of the show, titled "Communication Through Action," is to introduce Black children to Black cultural performing arts, according to Cheryl Garrett, group president.

Children in Southeast San Diego from Mountain View Park, Southcrest Park, Memorial Park, an adoption center, the YMCA, the YWCA and SOFA in La Jolla have been invited to the performance.

The show will also serve as a preview of the program the group will present at the Watts Summer Festival Aug. 18 in Los Angeles.

Performers in the program include Leo Howard,, Philip Harris, Adriana Richards, Ms. Garrett, Gie Simpson, Sandra Burton, Roy Galloway, Prentice Deadrick, Michael Curry, Talamu, Caspar "Chipper" Glenn, Tommy Calimee, Sylvia Johnson, Joan Coleman and Tim White. Toni Butler, a special guest dancer, will also appear with the group.

Some 70 UCSD students are members of the one-year-old association which was founded to further understanding of Black cultural arts within the university and the community, Ms. Garrett said.
