## AIRELELD SITE - SOUTR MEST AAPEI.

On the 29th September, 1967. I proceeded on a short patrol to BULUFA village in the South fent vapoi Compry Division with the express purpose of lavestigsting an area of gressland proviously mentioned as a poasible sito for dovelopment into a Category "A" Airstripe

## LOCATKOIS

Situated approx. one houre walk south-went of the present BULUWA village in the South Weat Wajel Coaves Divicion at approximate latitude 3 degrens 40 minutes 30 seconds south and longituce 142 degrees 01 minutes onat, (as pes Map 5A54-15 Series 2504 ray Survey). Present aecuse by wallaing track for siz hours fros LUMI.

DESCRTPRTOM of SICE.
Iocated at approximately 600 teet above sea level the aite is aituated on a slightiy raised aidge. Tho asen was paced for a 1 gagth of approximately 7000 seet along a magnetie bearing $153^{\circ}$. The norihera ead is approximately 350 foet wide with anali hillocks on the regtora side at between the $200 \mathrm{a} / 900 \mathrm{foet}$ marks. There 10 a slight depression at the 5000 foet sark and the ground falls away at about $.5 \%$ from the 6000 foet mark.

The C.M.M.L. Misaion are preseathy engaged In constructing a light alreraft 'atriip which commences at an area adjacent to the aite under rovier and which runs at appros. $165^{\circ}$ until it enters the perimeter of the site.

The aite 13 all grassland. The topsoil consists of about $2-3$ inchos of black soil with several fset of elay, and areas of stone underneath.

SITE PORTMPIAL.
It is conaldered that an aeroctrome, clase "X". of dimenaione of up to 6000 foet by 300 feet could be conatructed on the afte. There is no secondary growth to be removed and a Category "B" Alratrip could be easily oonstructed by hand, allowing hoavy oquipmont tc then be flom la. Altornatively, equipment could be placed on site by driving down the Gwenif Rivar bed. This would normally be auceeseful in the dry seamon. Sufficiont surfacing material would be available in the Owenif River, only one mile from the site.

## ITKERODUCRTON

Lumi Pabrol No. $467 / 68$ was conducted ctehin the lumi Local and Somoro Consus Diviaions as a rontine patrol with the additional aims of carrying out an Political gducation Program in vier of the fortheoming Loeal Governaent Council and House of Assembly Eleotions. Eleetions for the WAPSI L.G.G. have been given no fixed date at this time however they are due to occur in late october of this year.

Tvo Loeal Government Assistants, Mr G Bundari and Mr 5 Sananicooc acccompanied the Pabrol and aselated in the collaetion of Counoll taxes boing earried out by the WAPEI L.G.C. clork Mr I Iamo, and in the Council Heelth program being aupervised by the President,Awok Numulo.

Mr P Russell A.D.O. and Mr J Koibo alao accompanied the Patrel for bries periode of its duration

## RECEPTION TO THE PATROL

The aroa covered by this Patrol is $t$ ast sophistioated in the Luad Sub Distriet and therofor perhaps mox saustomed to the presence of a patrol. These people greet the pairol with the aim of gatning as mueh ashisturee and advice as they can. Thise does not moan that they are without reservation but that thoy do realiso the purpose of fueh Pain sle. Reforence to this fact is the number of complaints brought before the Patrol and the adiviee asked for relating to economic mutters.

## OUTLTAE OF POLITTCAL SITUATION

One of the duties of the patrol was to carry out a Political Educusbon program in viow of the fortheoming Local Government Council and House of Assoably olections.

In the course of this program the people were caused to express their views and opinions, likes and dislikes, of the system of government now in oporation.

The nost apparent feeling in this area, and one which the people will voice freely, is that thoy foel that thoy have been deluded by the lack of progress boing made, materialily, in their area. This was almost unanimously attributed to the gresont MHA Mr Makain Mo. As a result he has drawn much 111 feelinge

As a result of the recent viait, (early in June of this yoar) of the nowly formed Christion Demoeratic Party through the Lumi Local and Somoro Conaus Divisions, the people had a number of questions to put to the patrol. Two of the maln queries concerned weros-
(a) The pricipal of the Serenth State of Auatralia. In answering this the advantages and disadvantages wore pointed out and the people told that it was up to thon to make the decision, for or against. (b) The prineipal of a political party.

One incident was brought to the attention of the patrol while at the village of WILIVM in the Somoro Census Division. The Councillor and one MAKAIN, a mission aypointed official of the same village, approsehod the patrol with the idea of diseroditing rumors which allege that they are aetivoly ongaged in cargo eult aotivities. Thoy adnitted to boing followers of one IAIIOBEI of Rauwetel village a former suspeeted oult leader. (Rofor Luad File $51-2-1 / 243$ of 5 th December 1963 and $51-2-1 / 0 \mathrm{ph}$ of 10th January 1964). The axtont of his aetivities have dindniched over the past fer years. Due mainly to his age he is supposediy boyond the stage of being able to inciting the people any further. However acec intinc to the two informants he still retains his influence in the area and has a vast follouing not only in the lumi area but also extonding inte the Aitape sub Distriet.

In attempting to diseredit the rumors mentioned proviously, the two informante named a former Luluai of ZAUWETEI village who has been 1- the past, noted for cult activities, however this man is certainly : involved in any such activities at the present.

The concern shown in theses rumors is groundiess as there is no evidence to substantiate the presence of an active eult mevement at present.

The main reason for the rumors and acousations is a result of a fierce political rigalry in this area, (the area aurrounding the Fatima, Kamel and Brojol mission contres). There are two main parties in this rivalry. On the one hand there is the older generation who having been apparently deluded by the lack of achievement thsough their present MHA, would profer to see a leadorship with more spiritual guidance. One suggestion made was a form of Triumvirate with the aforenamed IANOBEI working in conjunction with two of the prieste of the om Misaion formeriy in the area, to represent their interestain the House of Assembly.

The second following comes from the younger generation and although they have no prodetormined leader they are united in their oritisisms of their elders bellefs. These are the ones who have had some form of education and who have worked in various other parts of the Territory and seen for themselves what the establishnent of a Purely Govemnental body can do for the advancement of the community.
part from the purely political problems there wire certain eocial problems brought to the patrols attontion which, it seams, are becouing increasingly important as there is a greater accoptance of the Governmont lave and those lavs made by the poople themselves through the Leenl Govarnment Council.

The most udgaificant problem is one involving the trape of pigs which still rates high in the local economy. The greator percentage of complaints concerning pigs involved the damage done to gardens by the animals.

Through improved oommunications the prestige of any one man is now not only reeognieed within his own olan but also aeknomiodged thioughout an area in which thore may be fifty or aixty elans. Consequently therb is a continual inerease in the standard of these things related to his aceusulated woalth, which includes the number of pigs he ovms and the sise of his gardens. Therofore this serves to aggrevatis a problem which this comunity has always had to face.

In the particular area along the Fatima Loop road there are over 3000 people in an area of approximately fifteen square adlos, this being the area affected nost by the problem. (For furthor detaile refor to Compladnte)

Another point brought to the patrola attention was one which in having an inoreaaling offeet on local trade. It ovolves from the altuation where goods are purchased on arodit. Credit is also given, to a limited extont. in the local pative ommed trade stores. Howover the buatnosses cemeorned keop fatirly tight rein oa these trancaetions. It is the loeal trade amonget the viliagors thomenves which constantly reault in dlagputes of complainte being laid. These diaputes avice whom a purely commerelal transuetioa takes place based on credit glven out of faith in soefal obligations. Confliction then arises between the Cormereial Lav of the Government and the lavs of the people governed by soelal obligation. Thid problea is more aceute when it involves older nembers of the community who place soaplote faith in the laws of their ancesteres.

If the people in this area as a coomunity are to achoive further oconomic dovelopment then thoy vill have to leara to remetriet thois soeial lawo as thoy ary confined to elan groupings therefore roatoleting trado. Possibly a more stricter comerelal law oould be onforeod reguleted by the people themeelves through the Local Government Council. This has in some means already been acheived however there is littie edherance to the deefaions already made.

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## AGRTCLETURE

The cilmate in the Lumi Local and Somoro Census Dietsions is ideal for the production of vegotable gapdens and in fact there are a number of anall gardens alroady bogun. The yrinetpal market gardenor in the aroa is Awok Numulo, Preaident of the Wapei LaC, who has done a lot to promote the idea in the area. Through his efforts the rest of the populatiou has come to realise the potential (although only local) in this field and as a eomeequence there is always a masll quantity of ousopesn vegetagles on sale at the local market.

Ons particular enterprise which was stortad zecently in Mareh 1966 is already producing vegetables for market. This is a business formed by a group of men in the EREYSI No. 2 and AKAITTM locality, on a joint gold mining venturb and has now been extended to market gardening. At present thore is a quarter aars of sice planted not jet matured, smail plote of corn und tomato with beds containing yotato, lettuce, cueumber, carrot. cablige and two varieties of melcua not zative to the area.

It has been estimated that for the yesu: 1966 a total of $\$ 4,150$ has bean spent by the Administration sad uisaicas on the purchase of native foods fron the LUmi Local and Somoro Census Divistons.

Cash oropping in the area is confined at present to the production
of rice and coffice both of which, as was indieated in patrol instructions are not to be setively oneouraged.

There are asveral plots of coffec harvested on a vory mall sozle (approudmately 201b per month) purchased privately through the om Miselion. However this coffec is of such poor quality, due to laelt of onthugiasa and sufficiont care being taken in the processing, that it is frequently unable to be resold.

Although rice gardening is expatiAng in the Lumi Sub Distriot there are no aignificant plota in the area covered by this patroll There are however, soveral acres of ground beling eleased for the planting of Paddy siec the mont aubstantial being 10 aeres belonging to the village of CTEI.

## porists

There is no commoreial uee boing made of tiender in the asea. The Adminintration hae establiohed a mililigg aite at RELTOTEI on adedaistration 1 nd where there is enough timber fo eupply tha noeds of butiding and maintenance for the prement.

Use is also beling made of local timber on a significent seale by the Lum Chil Misaion. The people of OPII village have been given aistance In clearing the land for purposes of rice gapdening. Tho Mission soccesmed has sntroduced a ohain mav, tractor and timber mill to the aite and la return can expeet rights to all timber eut down.

## GO MERCS AND THDNSTRX

Whore are 19 trade atores in the area 7 of which are ouned by Buropeans; all ompley a native store keoper.

Gold mining within the Lund Adndisistrative area, is carried out only in tho Lond Local and Scmore Coname Divicions. There are an estimated 300 men worlding gold in the WIMI and SIFA arecke (rofer Map) who over the past year have received in axcese of $\$ 850$ in gold payneate.
hecently started wae a business (mentioned previousiy under Agrieulturo) which intende mastiot gardoning on a seale never bofore atterpted by any single coneern in this Sub District. It has asita organigation head, ome ludvis 7ilamen zrom Karaitran, a young man with a Standard Four edueation and ao 111 mations as to the amount of work invoived in makeng much a buainees profitable. The garden alte is situated on EREYZII No. 2 ground and contadis approximatoly 20aeres, 5 aceses of whish has been alreedy cleared. Therr are tso dwollings nearing complotion and sevoral more planned as moll. as one builling intended to eerve as a trado atore whish as yot 18 not operative. In all there are 128 men working on the project and financial backing for the purchase of seeds and material comes froil sevoral amill gold mining businesses.

It is hoped that they fill be able to market the vegetables to Missions and station pergoilel in both the z umi and Aitape Sub Distriets. There has already been $\$ 8$ worth of produce sold to the iliselion in Aitape; thia is hardiy significant in itsoli, howevar as the businese is stil in the primary stages of development and if the present market is assured, then it show promise.

## LASD

Land in the aroa of the Somoro and Lumilocel Censu Diviaions is very unovenly distributed and although overall population denaity is 45 persons per aquare mile, there are a number of olans which own barely onough land on which to plant thoir food orops let alome attempting any each aropping.

One partiaular case in point is the village of ERETEI No. 1 in which there is a total of 288 porsons laying elaim to not mueh wore than one square nelle of land.

At present the people of Freiol 2 have farming rights to several aeres of land horrowed frou metghbouring FAUWETKI and SIBOTEI viliages which eupplemonte thotr erna. However the peopie of raumetol and siboted are proselag to roposesess the land to meot thoir own expanding neeks, and as Eretol lays no clalm to outright ownershis of the land it is obliged to risinuleh the iand. Thoy intond gathering this gear's orop fras the land without repianting. Soveral food trees remain and will have to be forfoited unless cettloment can be asranged.

The solution to this problea lies in the resettiomeat sohome on land juat boyond the Lumi Sub Distriet border, inalde the Altape Sub Diatriet mot more than one days walk away.

## COMPRATIRSS

There were mumerous complaints brought to the Patrol but all of these foll into three eatagories.

The fieot of these (mentiozed previousely undor Outisime of Politionl Situation) expressed disatiefaction whith the lack of work doae by the present uin tomards holping the peopie. zhis was brought out through disoussions on general politice and it was explained that it was up to the people to onaure that their Representatives were made awro of theiv responeibilitiss.

The second and most frequent complaint heard, concerned the loas of pige and damage to gardene caused by pigs. At least twenty of the thirtytwo villages visited brought forfrard complainta iavolving pige.

The Aseistant Local Court Magistrate, 3Lau from \#AGOITEI was on one oceseion, named as the owner of pige which had extensively damaged a mago gardoa belonging to a member of SIGAITEZI village, the latter demanding componsation. After a short dicoussien, slau admitted that he had reísed to make any payment as the belloved that the people of SJGAITEI village had, on aumerous provious occassions, killed and eaten pige belonging to him. Both partios wore advised that if thoy wiahed to being proceedings againat the other then they should take the case before the Local Court Magistrate at Lums.

This particular case serves to underline the problem of pigs, and possibly the only solution would be to pleee all animale in the area into enclosures. However this would prove a malloth task as far as the loeals are concerned not only in building the enclosures but also ic sering for the animals.

The third complaint wss diracted at the Administration itcelf concerning the rate of pay afforded to carriers by its patrols. The rate for carrigrs in this area is 10 e per man hour, however this rate is frequently sxceaded where villages are situated less than an hour apart yet atill recelve paynent for one hours caprying time. Also for long walke for loag walke a bonus payment is usually made where
carriors aay have to walk for soveral hours te roturn to their own Willage．Tet desyite this ，there frequent expresaion of epon disasatiafaction at the rates of jay．The people in this area have sald to the patrol that thoy would be astiaried with a rato five times that sot down by the Adeninistration．

Thore were no oomplaints brought to this patrol regayding bride prices，nor anything of that nature．The absonce of auch complaints is rather unuewin us it is definitely one of the bigeent probleme of thite area．

## courss

Thore wese no eaces brought before the Patrol which waswented a hearing at the sub Dletriet Office．

## 动宜 HOUSES

there are 28 Reat Howses betwoen 61 villages in the area patrolled． As many as three or four villages shy have a comson Reet llowe which is usually aituated on＂noutrai＂ground．Thore was only one case，in the viliage of MTMBITSI，whore inntruetions had to be given for the repait of a Reat House．In gneral the atandard was very geod．

## 累AWM

Thease was no Modical Orderly acocapanying the pataol as such mosvdees are not marrented in the erea patroliod whero there ase adequate faediltiee for the care of hoalth provided ky both kisersea and Adminiotration．

At the KARAITMg OFA dieaion station these is an Adrainiatration Add Poot in the care of an A1d Poat Orderly．This Ald Poot was eveetred rith funds provided by tho WAPEI 10 C and is a sond permenant structure． The area sursoundins the KARAITiMy Miselion is also pakrolled by a qualifiod murse doing iniant wolfare work．

8 There are two othe $x$ Adnindatrition Aid poats in the area， eftuated at the villages of KIWAWMEI and EILKILI．While the Patrol was In the ares of KIWAUSKI a child mas admittind to the hoalth olinic at Fatima with 2nd degree burna，however aut before reoelving traatment from the AI2 Post Orderky MXVAJMAI．His method of troentment was to apply adhegive plaefor to the affocted areas with consegent ataeafatrons resulte．It oould be that this perticular orderiy ie doing more hans than good in his job．The ild lost itself appoars to bo running satisfactoelly．

The Third Aid Poat at WIIKILI has only recently been estaplished． as at KARAITMM，with counell funds，and is made good use of by the locals．
Theme are chree other bealth contros in the aroa, the Fatima Miseicn Health Clinic staffed by 2 aisters and 2 Traineo Infant Wolfare nurees, an A1d Poot at the Brutel CMML Kiasion, and the Iymi loapetal which has reoontly aquired an $X$-ray uait and the addition of a matornity ward.

## EDUCATRCN

(P1ease refer to appendix for detalle of sehools in the arae).
One particular incident concerning etucation in the area was brot, to to attention of the Patrol in the village of callirmit, (luma Local Consus Division). The hoad men of the village were concerned with the nuinber of chadron continuuily aboont from the loeal oatechist achool. There are throe such schools in the area, operated by the lend Roman Catholic Miseion, providing a limited form of education. Theee
 at hand are the Fillagee of BUFtUM and ThaITKI. Within theee five viliagos those is a total of 118 malees and 147 feanales betwoen the agos of five to aixtenn not atterding any roeogniesd sohool. Dight ehildasen irom thise arga attend scool at the Lumi OMM Manion howevor this mohool is alroady full to eapaesty with $2 y n$ puyils.
The parnente In these five villages sadd that they would lifee officers authorised by the commeli to reund up all truments in the ase. At preamat the Trumat officor for the Wappri Looal Geveromont Couneli polices anily the reeognised actrools in the aroe.
Hr I Iamj, MAPSI Local Govornuset Comacil Clerk, acoompanting the patrol mado a obock on all schools in the area. Ir lamo is acting as Truant of cleor for the Council. The numbor of truants in the afoa amda aufficiently grnat to marrant action being taken by the eouncil.

## ROADS and BRTpGEA

Thore is, at precont, a road muruliag between Karkitian and YALUIIAPE MSamions under construetion. Thits being the orly work done at this tine in opening up new vehtocing rosden This parcicular roed morves oniy as a commulications link totween the two Mission stations and doos not look like being insimded troction as part of the main arterisil rosds in tho area. The roason for thise ia that the prosent road 11 niding IALUWAPE to Icnai station could never be ueed by houry traffic due to exoeasivo gredicats. Shore is anothor route through to KARAITGM area as yet, impassable to any foria of vehs.culer transport. Although a cettain amount of work had bean dona on it in the jast, when it was used as a notor sike track, it has now fallen into diaropatr two to the absonee of labour in the vicinity.
The Adadniutration has spent alnost $\$ 1200$ over the past yous in improving the excistiag roads in tho area while the WAPMI L. $G, C$. has spent 81334 on maintenance of the Luat - Fatiea Loop Road. As a roault of this, roade in the area are now in roasonable cuadition.
There is also a 200 yerd soction of goad being worked betwoen the villages of TOIAMKI and VIGOTVT. Theae poople are noer eagor to butld a road which will 13 nik them up with the uvin - Fatdma loop Road and thus, ofth the rest of the area.
For frether deteil on zoade in the area refor to Lumi Patrol Ropore H. 9 of $66 / 67$.

There is a proposed DC-3 airstrip aite at TLLOTEI, 10 minutes
drive froin the Sub District Office, on Administration land purchased for that purpose. At pressn's the land is being used for a timbor milling site.

Another posaible airstrip aite, nor choeast of the village of WANGIPI, is large onough for the construction of a oategory "C" airgerip. The reason for the intergest show in this site is due to the isolation of the area which at present has no other meens of communication than a foot rood to the KARAITRM ofm Hiseion five hours walk away. The people of the WAMPIPI area are keen to start a cash oropping buainess, however they realise th. futility of such a business without an outlot for teir produce.

## HABOUR

There are a numbor of sooioty businesess owned and operated by the people thenselves, however the only single inds genous employer of labour in the Iub District is the local Kember for Heuse of Assembly, Maknin Mo, who owns two head of cattie, several acres of rice gardens and a trade atore.

There is an adequate supply of iabour in the area; men who are eager to find work but who are not prepared to work unless the wages are su.fieiently high snough.

There is one Furopean Recruiter in the area who recrults labour withia the Lumi Administration Area, however declines to take recruite from the arca covered by this Patrol ( 1.0 . the Lumt local and Somero Consue Divisions) due to the fact that labourore frpm this area have a reputation for dishonouring contracts as indentured labour.

## PERSONAL TAX

There were one or two instances where incividuals ot iirst refuced to pay tax, however when threatened with court action, hid no trouble in finding the money. It was not necessary to institute pny court proceedings. Occasionally there were cases where tax payers pail (there tax with obvious bad grace. The two villages in which the greatest number of complaints w)ere registered were caKAI in the Sonoro $\mathrm{c} / \mathrm{d}$ and KBIBAM in the Lumi Local c/d. generally the people in the Lumi Local and Somoro Census Divisions will pay tax to the Council without complaine.

Over $\$ 4000$ was collected in tazes, $\$ 1000$ thils more than was estimated. The Counvil rate of tax is $\$ 1.50$ pere mand and for vomen. although people from the rajority of villages vieited could afford to pay a higher rate of tax, there were a few of the more remote villages which could barely manage to pay at the prasent rate.
census
One particular trend revealed by the consus figgures is the large number of poople from the villages of KALAU, RAUWEMYEI, MIWAUTEI, WILBEITBI, TOLGELI, WIGOERI, AND WISUTEI, WHO ARE MIGRATInE out of the Sub Distriet. These villages all range along the border of Aitape Sub Distriet where the greater percentage of these emigrants go. Whole families have resettled in he Aitape Sub District and find employment with the Administration and private concerns. The total number of absentees from these villages was 187 in 1962 , it has now risen to 482 excluding absentee students

## COMCLUBIOH

The polltical education tulks given regarding the fortheouing Lopal Goveruent Counci. 1 and House of Aseembly Flections, wore arpreclated In oniy a very fex instances. Only tho fact that oceassionally someone would ask a question of expreas an opinion, (generally of the form as in paragraph 3 of "Outiline of The Political Situation") was any indication given that the talka were undersiood. Generally the attitude regiatored was oun of boredow, as though they no longer had any interest in the ideas behind a represeafation in a Goverrusezt.

In this the Local governaeat sounsil drew more interest, however thic intefest, when raised, simply expreased the dissaphintrient in its lack of achievement. In atforapting to solidify their faith in tho Couneil. the various projeets it had accomplished, (and those to be attempted) were mamed, then it was pointed oct that with the increase in the size of the counoil and change over to muiti-kacial" they would aeo an even greater rate of developement than bofore.

In the Political Sducation talles and in answoring all questions put to the patrol on this subject, roference was made to the boolclet "Govermant in Papua and New Guineal

Coname revision for the preparation of new Tac Census books was carried out and all names recouded in loaghand as instruction.

Members of the Council Thx Tribunal and former Prosideat of the WAPEX L.G.C. accompanied the patrol. Kr Sarankeoc and President Awok made an inspection of each rillage as part of a Council Realth Frogram.

The Council Tax Patrol completed the area one week after the atand down of this patrol.

In the afternoou I had a short heok ofer a seetien of land offored by the people of Kamnum as a possible townehip aite. Patrol slopt at GUTAIXA.
Rose 0600 and departed on further feasibllity survey of possible road routes tocard the airstrig site. Carriers Aollowed the established traciks to Buzawn.
Rein for most of the day again teday. Arrived at MAKUL, late in the afternoon and spent the evening in discuseions with men from Gutaiya, Bulawa, Galgatu and Yukile who had heard of the proposed survey of the airstrip aite and had come to offer asnistance. slept MaKUL.

Rese 0620.
Heavy rain in the early morning reduced to a driazle finz which lasted nost of the mording and early afternoon.

0605 hours - Carriers went direet to YUFABI via BULAWh. I took gusdes from BULAMA and we cut our way aloag the main ridge 1ime to the north of worth east.

## Rose 0450.

Departed from YUTABI with first light at 0600. Carriers direat to Luai winlat myeelf and a yoliceman and guides roaumed following the ridge line. Two seperate alternatives of connecting the road route with the LUKI - DREIKIKIK road were incestigated both were possible but not ideal - some steep slopes te be negotiated.
Returned to Luni during the afternoon. Patrol ends.

## LWMI PARACL RMRORT No. 13-62/68

The attached copy of Patrol Instructions, 67-1-1 of 19th January, 1968 and the Secretarg, Department of the Administriter's 1-3-32 of 14 th Nlovember. 1967, refer.
This patrol was mounted and departed from Lumi on Monday 22nd January, 1968. The first day was apent following ridge-lines (previously noted fron the air) to ascertain the feasibility of a euitable connecting road from Lumi te the proposed airatrip site at MAKUL, a hamlet of BULAFA VILLAGG: In the afternoon of the firat day, the Councillor from KAMNUM indicated an area of land of approxiastely oight hundred acree, which is owned by his fanily, who is quite willing tc sell the land to the Adainiatration for the purpose of setting up a headquarters. The people would make a larger portion of land available if necessary. The area averages approximetely 1,100 feet above sea level and has well drained areas aultable for housing etc. and is alco adjacent to abundant fresk water supplies.
The patrol spent the night et Gutaiya, where further diacuasions were held as to the availability of land and posaible road routes. The people from Gutaiya also wore willing, in fact entbualastic, to make land available for a town site if requited by the Administration.
However it was thought that the higher land owned by KANNUM would make a more plensant site for a township - boing genorally cooler and having more attractive views and sites for buildinge. Nothing was taken past the Aiscussion stage and it was impressed upon the peogle throughout the patrol that the patrol was only conduating a survey and that it may not progress any further - thase people often belleve what they wish to believe, so considerable tims was spent convincing them that the investigation did not necessarily mean that the township and airstrip would Pollow.
The second day the patrol continued on along ridges to Hakul, a hamlet adjacent to the ppoposed'strip site. Quite a auitable road route exiats from Lumi to Makul. Nowhere weald the road have to cross a watercourse axcept two ceses where it might be convenient to oross

the extreme hadwartors of small areaks. These would require only aulverts, not bridges.
The roadroute is indieated on the attached Patrol Kap.
Further diseusaions with people from Calgatu, ailiato and Bulaws revealed that there are numerous aites for a townahip available adjacent to the airatrip site. The people are all willing to make aites available, lut it was thought that the altitude of the airstrip site, approximately 700 feet above sea level, would not be ae pleasant as the higher altitudes.

A shain, compass and Abney levol survey rovealed that the proposed airstrip oits is quite ample for requirementes Commeneing at a point approxianeely 200 jarde on a bearing of $376^{\circ}$ from the single tall coconut in hakul hamlet, the strip aite extends for a possible maximum length of slightly over two miles at a fall of cpproximately half a degree over that distance and on a sagnetie bearing of exaetly $150^{\circ}$, os, roughly South south east.

The most suitable section for a $6,000^{\circ}$ airstrip with the mindmum amount of levelling or filling, is the aection beginning approxinately 3,000 feet fro the south of south east, or lower, end of the ontire two wile length. This would also give natural elearanes without the felling of trees, of approximately $f^{?}$ at the lower ond and slightly less that $3^{\circ}$ at the higher or northern end. Felling of the trees on the approaehea from the north would bring the olearanees to an estimated $1=2^{\circ}$.

The greatest depresaion in the airstrip sice is approximately 5\% chaine long and about $10-12$ feet in dopth at the doepest seetion. At only one point - near the northern a d would width be limited and then only to -oout five hundred feet - a slight swinging of the southern opd further south could eliminate thie but would entail greator filling if the airstrip ovor required extenaion past seven or elght thousand feet.

Drainage of the airetrip aite soems relativoly simple; it is on natural graseland which is elovated approximately thirty feet above the surrounding creeks. The only water draining onto the area comes from the ridge on which Nakul hamlet is situated. This water could be diverted by construsting a lerge drain around the bese or termination of the ridge and draining approximately norki east into the Bura oreek, hat runs gonerally south eact into the Gwenif river - refor to the attached sketch map. Surface water would be drained
off the airetrip in the normal manner of constructing the surfice with a camber and porimeter drains.

On the day following the completion of the airstrip survey the patrol investignted tho feasibility of another road route towarde LUHI, by crossing the Gwenif river and following a ridge generally north of north enst. The people of Bulama Indiested to se an area of approximately 950 acres of land that they would be willing to sell to the diainistration. The road route followed by the patrol, and the approximate looation of the land aentioned are shown on the attached Patrol Map.

For several reasons, the first route investigaved seeas to be preferable to the secona. The sain reason is the crossing of the Gwenif river. The river is very suitable to fording in dry weather, but it is subject to frequent flooding and unless a steel and conerete bridge at least six hundred feet in length was constructed, people landing at the airstrip, or wiahing to embark on an aireraft could be seriousiy inconvenienced. The cont of such a bridge would be lyreat and in my opinion would not justify the expense when taking into consideration the fagt that the alternative route requires no bridges at all. Ajso the firat, or weatorly, route is auch more oonvenient and direct as far as the Sub-Diatrict lieadquaters, Lumi is concerned.

The township aite situated near Kamnum would be approxiantely olght road miles fros the airetrip. This hod the advantage of placing It as near to the population centre as poasible while still allowing plenty of room for expansion i.e. further north the area becomes more denely populated and large areas of land are not readily available.

There are only 304 people living within five miles of the airstrip site, and 583 within five miles of the eastern town aite however there are 2,005 people within five mile of the KAMNM site. The villages and their popalations are:

(1) There is ample land available - far more than the Secretary serrated as a requirement.
(ii) The people are willing, even onthualatie, toward the sale of the land for the construction of an airatrig and the extablishment of a township.
(iii) The population within five alleys of the 'atrip ate ia only 304, but Athin five miles of the proposed township site it is 2,005 and within fifteen miles of the proposed township site these are approximately 17,818 people.
though the patrol onnountored much rain and poor weather it received the utmost eg-oporstion from the people, which made it a pleasant patrol.

## Thuraday: June 6th.

Tipas village ia in the midale of the Sepik River on an island and the village owned powered oanoo used to ferry patrol and equipment.
