Names have been chosen for the new buildings on the campus. At their February meeting, The Regents decided that the new large office and laboratory building at the southern end of the campus shall be called Harald Sverdrup Hall, in honor of the third Director of the Scripps Institution.

The new lecture hall will be called Francis B. Sumner Auditorium. The late Professor Sumner was a biologist on the Scripps faculty.

The Regents also decided that the entire F-shaped structure consisting of Ritter Hall and its two wings should be known as William E. Ritter Hall, and that the former General Services Building and George H. Scripps Laboratory Building should be known as George H. Scripps Building.

Chancellor York's appointment by the Board of Regents was announced by President Clark Kerr at the Riverside meeting. Chancellor York, who is 39, has been on leave from the Berkeley campus since March 1959. He had served as Director of the Radiation Laboratory at Livermore.

A native of Rochester, New York, the Chancellor received his Ph.D. in physics at Berkeley in 1949. He had taken his A.B. at the University of Rochester in 1942 and his Master's in 1943.

"Although a relatively young man, Dr. York brings a rich combination of training and experience to the position of Chancellor of the San Diego campus", President Kerr said.

"The University already has one of the world's greatest research institutions at La Jolla, in the Scripps Institution of Oceanography.
