

Announcement for all types of housing for off-campus students

August 8, 1975

Housing accommodations of all types, from single rooms to houses, are urgently needed for students, faculty and staff returning to the University of California, San Diego for the fall quarter.

Classes begin Monday, Sept.22, for more than 9400 graduate and undergraduate students attending Revelle, Muir, Third, and Fourth Colleges, Scripps Institution of Oceanography and the School of Medicine. About 3,100 of these can be housed on campus, with a small percentage living at home, but the remaining students will need to find accommodations in the surrounding communities.

The university population is composed of a variety of ages and cultures. There are singles and marrieds and marrieds with children.

Many of the single undergraduates are willing to share 2, 3 or more bedroom houses or apartments. Single graduate students usually prefer to live alone or share housing with one other student. Foreign scholars and visiting faculty and staff with their families also need 'varying types of apartments and houses.

The Off-Campus Housing Assistance Office at UCSD will receive and publicize listings for accommodations and will aid both the landlord and the renter in any transaction. Lease and rental agreement forms, housing pamphlets, maps and community information are also part of the services offered by the office.

The only condition to using the services of the office to post listings is the agreement to uphold the university's policy of accepting all students, faculty and staff regardless of color or creed.
